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NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING SOUTH DAKOTA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION

In the Matter of the Application of Dakota Access, LLC for an Energy Facility Permit to Construct the Dakota Access Pipeline Project

SDCL 49-41B-15 and 49-41B-16, the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) will hold public input hearings at the above locations on an Application for an Energy Facility Permit filed December 15, 2014, by Dakota Access, LLC (Applicant) for the Dakota Access Pipeline Project (Application). The Application requests Commission approval of a permit to construct a 12-inch to 30-inch pipeline approximately 271.6 miles in South Dakota for the purpose of transporting crude oil (Project). The line will cross the South Dakota and Iowa border in Campbell County, South Dakota and extend south and east through McPherson, Edmunds, Faulk, Spink, Beadle, Kingsbury, Minnehaha, Turner, and Lincoln Counties, exiting South Dakota at the South Dakota/Iowa border in Lincoln County. The Project also includes one pump station in South Dakota, located approximately seven miles southeast of Redfield in Spink County.

At each public hearing, Applicant will present a brief description of the Project, following which interested persons may appear and present questions, views, and comments regarding the Application and Project. Pursuant to SDCL 49-41B-15(5), the Application is on file in the Campbell County Auditor's Office in Pierre, and the Application and all other documents in the case, including detailed Project maps, may also be accessed on the Commission's web site at www.puc.sd.gov under Commission Actions, Commission Dockets, Hydrocarbon Pipeline Dockets, 2014 Hydrocarbon Pipeline Dockets, HP14-002.

Any person who is aggrieved by this proceeding are currently the Applicant and the Commission's staff (Staff). Pursuant to SDCL 49-41B-17, any person, including in the area of the Project, each municipality, county, and governmental agency in the Project area, any non-profit organization or individual, or in part to promote conservation or natural beauty, to protect the environment, personal health or other biological values, to protect historical sites, to promote consumer interests, to represent commercial and industrial groups, or to promote the orderly development of the region, or any interested person, may be granted formal party status in this proceeding by making written application to the Commission on or before February 13, 2015. Application for Party Status forms will be available at the public input hearings, or on the Commission or the Commission's web site.

At public input hearings, the Commission may schedule a formal evidentiary hearing conforming to SDCL Chapter 1-26 to consider any issues raised by an intervening party, Commission Staff, or the Commission itself. At such formal hearing, all parties will have the opportunity to appear, present evidence, and cross-examine the other parties' witnesses and exercise all other rights afforded by SDCL 1-26, 49-1 and 49-41B and ARSD 20:10-22:40 on or before February 13, 2015. Absent a contested issue, the Commission will schedule the matter for decision at a regular or special meeting of the Commission.

The Applicant must show that the Project will comply with all applicable laws and rules, will not pose a threat of serious injury to the health, safety, or welfare of the region, will not substantially impair the health, safety, or welfare of the inhabitants or expected inhabitants in the siting area, will not substantially impair the health, safety, or welfare of the inhabitants, and will not unduly interfere with the orderly development of the region with due consideration having been given to the needs of the inhabitants and of affected local units of government. Based upon these factors, the Commission will decide whether the permit is granted, denied, or granted upon such terms, conditions or modifications of the construction, operation, or maintenance as the Commission may determine. The parties will have the right to appeal the final decision in this case to the appropriate Circuit Court by serving and filing a notice of appeal of the decision in accordance with SDCL 1-26-31, within thirty (30) days after the date of service of the notice of decision in this case.
