As owner/operator of the R&R Pheasant Hunting Lodge and Roseland Ranch, I want to urge you to support the plan before you to build the Dakota Access Pipeline. This project represents a long-term investment in our region that would deliver 450,000 barrels of crude oil a day from the Bakken and Three Forks production areas to multiple sites for processing, allowing America to use our own energy resources rather than import oil from the Middle East.

As a rancher and a business owner, my support is contingent upon the fact that the job will be done in a manner that protects my way of life, and protects the state of South Dakota's vital land resources. I've done my research. And I am more than comfortable with this project.

I want to commend Energy Partners for its diligence in protecting the environment and the land. The company has committed to meet individual landowner needs as it proceeds from preliminary land surveys to actual construction and, at later stages, compensation should there be any damage. It has publically voiced its intention to protect our state's natural resources.
