## RE: North Dakota Petroleum Council support for Keystone XL Pipeline

The North Dakota Petroleum Council supports the Keystone XL pipeline and urges you to you to accept the certification of the permit Issued in 2010 to construct the Keystone XL Pipeline. After seven years and numerous environmental reviews, we have confidence that the pipeline is absolutely in our nation's best interest. The review of this project by both state and federal regulators has been thorough, public and encompassing, and has yielded extraordinarily positive results. It is time to move the project forward!

North America is in the midst of an energy renaissance. Yet, the United States lacks sufficient energy infrastructure to fully realize the benefits of this remarkable surge in oil production.
