Discontinuation of our natural gas service would disrupt my Precision Planting business, my seed corn dealership, both my and my father's farm operations, and my brother-in-law's trucking enterprise. It would also disrupt my fiance's and my household, as well as my parent's household and aunt/uncle's household.

After looking into the expenses that would be required to change my household and each of my businesses over to propane, I have found I would not be able to afford the conversion out-of-pocket and would have to look into financing this would be a huge blow to my business cash flows at this time of poor ag commodity prices.

My fiancé and I are asking you, our elected PUC representatives, to fulfill your duty as a publicly elected body and represent us in this dispute over access to and receipt of natural gas to ensure our household and business futures continue and prevent us from incurring any undo hardships.

Regarding the issue at hand, our farm gas tap service is very useful and would be a great loss if discontinued. My understanding of all aspects of the situation may be incomplete, but I do know the roles of Northern Natural Gas as well as Northwestern Energy, and see in the docket filings your conclusion that Northern Natural Gas is not a public utility. It would be difficult to believe that Northwestern Energy could somehow excuse itself from public utility status and thus be able to terminate gas service to the farm taps, without being accountable to state regulatory action. I believe the commission needs to step up and hold Northwestern Energy accountable for the needs of the South Dakota farm tap customers. On behalf of many residents of District 16, I would ask that you maintain the access to natural gas by the farm customers that have a legal right to this energy source. It has been clearly demonstrated to me that this right was granted at the time the easements were signed. My understanding is that these easements are perpetual. None of them had an expiration date.

The financial compensation paid at the time the pipeline was installed was almost insignificant by today's standards. The real benefit then and for the future was access to natural gas. The pipeline company knows this and I believe they are still supportive of the farm taps. The gas company using the pipeline also knew this at the time they signed their contracts with the pipeline company. They should not be allowed to unilaterally change that contract which would in effect cancel the easements without negotiation or just compensation to the property owners.


