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SUMMARY OF CULTURAL RESOURCES FINDINGS—MISSOURI PORTION OF THE KEYSTONE PIPELINE PROJECT

Between May 17 and June 15, 2006, American Resources Group, Ltd. (ARG), conducted a Phase I survey of accessible sections of the Missouri segment of the proposed Keystone pipeline route. Approximately 34 miles of the project corridor were surveyed at that time, resulting in the identification of 21 archaeological sites. The first interim report, dated September 29, 2006, describes the results of this survey, including preliminary site evaluations and management recommendations. Based on data recovered during the Phase I survey, 11 of the 21 identified sites were judged to meet the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) criteria of significance and, as a consequence, were evaluated as potentially eligible for listing on the NRHP. It was recommended that each of the potentially eligible sites be avoided or, if avoidance proved infeasible, that Phase II testing be conducted at each site to formally evaluate their NRHP eligibility.
