Limited Waiver of Service Territory Agreement

This Limited Walver of Service Territory Agreement, dated as of August 18, 1997, ("Walver"), is entered into by and between the Town of Pickstown, a town incorporated under the laws of the State of South Dakota (hereinafter referred to as "Pickstown"), and charles Mix Electric Association, Inc., a rural electric cooperative (hereinafter referred to as "Cooperative").

Recitals

WHEREAS, the parties hereto entered into a certain Service Territory Agreement dated January 1, 1990, whereby the parties with the approval of the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission, defined their respective service areas relative to the boundaries of Pickstown all pursuant to SDCL 49-34A-55; and

WHEREAS, The United States Department of Army, Corps of Engineers, has determined that street lighting is required at the location of the spillway boat ramp, located south of Pickstown, South Dakota, as shown by the attached plats and maps; and

WHEREAS, said location within the territory is served by the Cooperative; however, the Cooperative's closest electrical service line is at least 2 miles from the location described above, and Pickstown has a current electrical service nearby; and

WHEREAS, various street lights and other electrical service are to be located at said location, all of which are within the territory served by the Cooperative; and

WHEREAS, Pickstown and the Cooperative agree that it is in their best interests as well as the best interest of the public that only one of the parties provide electrical services to the boat ramp so as to avoid unnecessary duplication of services and the expenses associated therewith;

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS WAIVER WITNESSETH THAT:

For and in consideration of the mutual benefits to be received by the parties hereto and in further consideration of the covenants, promises, and provisions herein contained, it is hereby agreed and stipulated that

1.

Pickstown shall provide electrical services to a metering and connection point as constructed and located in the Cooperative's territory, to-wit: The Southwest Quarter (SW-k) of 9.95 65, as is more fully shown by the attached maps, and shall thereby provide electrical services to the street lights illuminating the aforesaid boat ramp, as well as any future electrical sepansion in the boat ramp area, that may, from time to time, be required by the United States Department of Army, Corps of Engineers. Such electrical services shall be provided at such rates as Pickstown shall have established or may subsequently establish. The Cooperative hereby waives its rights and privileges under the Service Territory Agreement dated January 1, 1990, solely and for the limited purpose of allowing Pickstown to serve the street lights to be located in the Cooperative's territory near the spillway boat ramp or any other future expansion by the United States Department of Army, Corps of Engineers, as is shown by the attached plat and map, which is incroporated herein by this reference thereto.

3.

This waiver shall continue indefinitely until such time as the Cooperative shall elect, pursuant to this provision to revoke this Waiver. Such revocation shall be effective 120 days following receipt of written notice of revocation provided to Pickstown by the Cooperative. The Cooperative may exercise its right of revocation at any time and for any reason subject only to the 120 day notice stated above.

4.

The parties hereto contemplate that the United States Department of Army, Corps of Engineers will construct all necessary electrical facilities from and after the metering and connection point and neither the Cooperative nor Pickstown shall have any responsibility or liability relating to the facilities to be constructed, installed, maintained, operated, or provided by the United States Department of Army, Corps of Engineers.

5.

This Waiver is subject to the approval of the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission under SDL 49-34A-55 and related statutes and shall not be effective until such approval is granted.

IN WITNESS WHFEREOF, the parties have executed this Waiver as of the date first written and subject to the approval of the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission. The officers signing for Pickstown represent that they are so authorized and that the Waiver has been approved by resolution of the Board of Trustees of Pickstown. The undersigned representatives of the Cooperative likewise represent that the Board of Directors of the Cooperative has approved this Waiver by resolution and has authorized its execution in the manner foregoing.

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IN THE MATTER OF THE FILING BY THE TOWN OF PICKSTOWN, SOUTH DAKOTA, AND CHARLES MIX ELECTRIC ASSOCIATION, INC. FOR APPROVAL OF AN ELECTRIC SERVICE TERRITORY AGREEMENT ORDER GRANTING APPROVAL OF THE SERVICE TERRITORY AGREEMENT EL 97-017

On September 5, 1997, the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received a filing by the Town of Pickstown. South Dakota, and Charles Mux Electric Association, line, for approval of an electric service territory agreement. The agreement is between the Town of Pickstown (Pickstown) and Charles Mux Electric Association, line (CMEA). Both parties agreed that CMEA would give Pickstown the nght to serve a boat ramp area operated by the United States Department of Army, Corps of Engineers. Both parties believe this agreement promotes efficiency and is in their best interests and the best interests of the public. The United States Department of Army, Corps of Engineers, as the affected customer, has been notified and, on August 18, 1997, signed the agreement between Pickstown and CMEA. Consenting to the agreement.

The area of service rights affected by this Order is described as that territory currently in CMEA's territory described as. The Southwest Quarter (SW1/4) of Section 9. Township 95 North, Range 65 West, in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, and which is further known as a boat ramp area on the Massouri River including street lights illuminating the boat ramp, as well as any future electrical expansion in the boat ramp area that may, from time to time, be required by the United States Department of Army, Corps of Engineers.

On September 25, 1997, at its regularly scheduled meeting, the Commission considered the request for approval of the exchange. Commission staff recommended approval.

The Commission finds that it has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL 49-34A, specifically, 49-34A-4, 49-34A-42, and 49-34A-55. Further, the Commission finds that the waiver of service terrotary nghts will promote efficiency and is in the best interests of Pickstown, CNEA, and the public. The Commission therefore concludes that the transfer of service rights is in the public interest and the request shall be granted. As the Commission's final decision in this matter, it is therefore.

ORDERED that the request seeking approval of the agreement of limited waiver of service territory described herein and incorporated by reference shall be approved.
