I am a Black Hills Power & Light customer in Sturgis and I am very concerned and upset about the rate increase they are going to put in place in April **BEFORE** approval from the PUC (according to the news media.) The news media says that the increase could be as high as 26%. This will be extremely hard on every customer; private, city, schools, etc. because budgets are set and there are no provisions for such a huge increase, especially in today's financial climate. As a former employee of the school district for 33 years, I know what such an increase could cause for the school district, LOSS OF JOBS! There is no other place to cut.
