Thanks for your note. I am assuming you are talking about Black Hills Power, as MDU doesn't have any rate increase requests pending before the Commission.

The requested 26.6 percent increase is a big one. We are giving the request a great deal of scrutiny and have assigned five PUC analysts, a PUC attorney, and two outside consulting firms to this case. At the end of this process, we will have a good feel for what the truth is . . . how much is Black Hills Power earning, have they made prudent decisions, and what is a reasonable rate? Our decision will ultimately be based on the facts in evidence.
