Thanks for your email. Please accept my apologies that it has taken so long for me to get back to you.

You raise several important issues. We have spent more than 1400 hours digging into the specifics of this case, and I can promise you that whatever the PUC finally decides will not result in excess profits for BHP. The whole point of our proceeding is to make sure that Black Hills Power receives reasonably recovery for their prudently-incurred expenses and not one dollar more. A fair rate of return is required under law, but there is currently a settlement stipulation filed (it has not been approved by the PUC) that would set that return at 8.26%.
