Black Hills Power proposed rate increase

Members of the Public Utilities Commission:

I am writing out of concern for the proposed rate increase you have received from Black Hills Power. Our school district's last full-year cost for services provided by BHP was \$202,000, a significant part of our operational budget. An increase of 26.6% would cost our school district an additional \$53,700 a year, or about 1.5 FTE teaching positions. For a school district that has already been forced to cut over \$2 million from its operating budget over the past decade, this request will cost us additional programs, staffing and opportunities for our students. I have included a list of the cuts made here in Spearfish to illustrate just how difficult and drastic those cuts have been. And as you consider the impact on our schools here in Spearfish, understand that we are just one of many school districts that will be impacted, and likely be forced to cut educational opportunities for South Dakota students. Including Spearfish and five neighboring school districts, the annual cost to operating budgets surpasses \$212,000.

Thank you for your consideration of our concerns.
