SERVICE TERRITORY EXCEPTION AGREEMENT BETWEEN SOUTHEASTERN ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE AND CENTRAL ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE

Central Electric Cooperative (Central) and Southeastern Electric Cooperative (Southeastern) jointly agree to allow Southeastern to provide electric service to a well pump service that is located within Central's electric service territory in the NE ¼ of Section 12 of 103N – 57W of Edgerton Township Hanson County, South Dakota.

While this parcel of land resides within the existing Central Service Territory as established in 1975 by the South Dakota Legislature and codified in SDCL 49-34A-42, Southeastern's facilities are more conveniently located relative to providing service to this customer. Central's facilities are 3,000 feet to the service location, while Southeastern has an existing power line 900 feet to the service location.

A drawing of the service site is attached to this agreement as exhibit A. Ken Steichen, customer, desires that Southeastern connect this facility and serve the electrical load.

Central and Southeastern have concluded that, in this instance, the customer's interests will be best served by receiving service from Southeastern and have agreed to this exception to the existing territorial agreement.

We also agree that each such instance where territory boundaries become a factor it will be dealt with on an individual basis.

This consent on the part of Central is limited to the said service to the service described and this territory exception will automatically terminate upon removal or abandonment of such service.

This exception is not to be construed as having any impact upon or indicating a desire to change the service areas assigned by the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission.

The Parties agree to jointly submit these agreed upon changes to the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission for approval.
