Dear Executive Director Van Gerpen:

Otter Tail Power Company (Otter Tail or the Company) respectfully submits the attached letter on behalf of Agropur to the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission (SD Commission) regarding the Commission's request at its November 27, 2018 meeting for supplemental information.

Otter Tail also provides in Table 1 below for public view the Total Resource Test results for the energy efficiency projects being considered.

In addition, within Data Request SD-PUC-03-06 in this docket, the Company stated, “If this customer continues with its plan to install the identified energy efficient measures, it will reduce energy purchases, it will avoid and defer additional capital investment for all South Dakota customers, and it will keep South Dakota’s load lower, likely resulting in less cost allocations to the state.” In its response to Data Request SD-PUC-09.06 filed November 28, 2018, in Otter Tail’s current General Rate Case, Docket No. EL18-021, Otter Tail estimated an increase of \$2.5M in its revenue deficiency compared to the supplemental test year due to the expansion occurring at Agropur as it is currently forecasted with energy efficiency measures being installed at the facility. If the energy efficiency measures are not installed at the facility, the revenue deficiency would increase an additional \$600k to \$3.1M.

Otter Tail appreciates the SD Commission’s review of this request and the questions asked by the SD Commission. We are available to address the Commission as well as Staff on the details of this filing and any other topics the Commission may have to foster wise energy use by South Dakotans.
