Hello, my name is Dustin Addy from Canistota, SD. I would like to comment on Docket number EL16-022, (the Prevailing Winds Project).

I farm near Canistota, SD on a family farm. I am an investor in Prevailing Winds because I am a very strong believer in clean renewable energy sources.
