
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

The South Daketa Public Utilities Commission will hold apublic input hearing at the above time and place on an application to construct approximately 10.42 miles of 345 kilovolt (kV) overhead transmission line, a substation and associated facilities (Project) tocated entirely within Deuel County South Dakola. The Projectis proposed by Flying Cow Wind, LLC (Applicant), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Rearing Fork Wind, LLC, the joint venture formed by subsidiaries of its affiliate Renewable Energy Systams/maricas inc., and Vestes Wind Systems A/S. The starting point of the transmission line for the Projectis proposed to be located in Government Lot 2 of Section 34 in Township 114N, Range 47W, Norden Township. The ending point will be in the NW 1/4 of Section 22, Township 113N, Range 48 West, Scandicavia Township. The Projects expected to be in service by the third quarter of 2020.

The purpose of the public input hearing will be to hear public comments regarding the permit Application and the Projects. At the hearing, Applicant will present a brief description of the Project, following which Interested persons may appear and present their views, comments and questions regarding the Application. A copy of the Application is on file with the Devel County Auditor pursuant to SDCL 49-41B-15(5) and at the Commission's office in Plane.
