

Following the public input hearing, the Commission may schedule a formal evidentiary hearing col Chapter 1-26 to consider any issues raised by any party, the Commission's staff, or the Commiss formal hearing, all parties will have the opportunity to appear, present evidence, and cross-examine witnesses and exercise all other rights afforded by SDCL Chapters 1-26, 49-1, and 49-41B and 20:10:01 and 20:10:22, including rights of appeal to the courts.

For approval, Dakota Range must show that the proposed Project will comply with all applicable will not pose a threat of serious injury to the environment nor to the social and economic condition expected inhabitants in the siting area, will not substantially impair the health, safety or welfare and will not unduly interfere with the orderly development of the region with due consideration h to the views of governing bodies of affected local units of government. Based upon these factors will decide whether a permit to construct should be granted, denied, or granted upon such ter modifications of the construction, operation, or maintenance as the Commission finds appropriate Pursuant to the Americans with Disabilities Act, this hearing is being held in a phy location.
