Pursuant to SOCL 49-418-15 and 49-418-16, the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission will hold a public input hearing at the above time and place on an application by Dakota Range III, LLC/a wholly owned subsidiary of Apex Clean Energy Holdings. LLC (Detote Range or Applicant) to construct an approximately 8-mile 345-Kerveli (KV) interconnective transmission line and an up to 151.3-megawait (MW) wild emagy conversion facility (Project). The Project will be in Grant and Roberts Counties, South Dekola, with the wind portion in an 18,717-acre area. The transmission line will not teen the Project's substation located in section 13 of Blooming Valley Township, outside the public right of way along 455° Avgnua, luming easi on Farmington Townships, 150° Street to the switchyard owned by Ottonial Power, lossibility section, 14 of Mazappa Township. The projectile expected to be in service by December 31, 2030, with a total or up to 42 wind liatines and associated facilities. Diskota Range estimates the total cost of the proposal Project to be approximately \$200 million

By using rotational grazing, cross fencing, and creating more water facilities for their more water facilities for their Red Angus herd, they have in-creased grass production, plant diversity and their livestocks overall health. Diverse grop rotations, reduced till grop pro-duction, and their grasslands met all manages to jimit soil and nutrient runoff to increase and preserve soil bealth. Through the years the Am-mann's have been achive per-tionarts in NRCS conservation programs that include both Conservation Stewardship Pro-Conservation Stewardship Pro-

gram (CSP) and Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP), Through these programs, the Ammann's have ex-perienced increased quality in their water sources through in-skilled rural water, a well, water pipelines, water facilities, and dugouts. Rick and Shelly have installed cross-forces for rotational grazing, better graz-ing distribution, and increased tangeland health. Their management practices are very succossful, and they have potential for increased carrying capacity in their pastures.

For the past several years, they have planted cover crops following the small grain crop through CSP to improve soil health. By using reduced tillnearm. By using reduced till-age in a corn, bean, and small grain rotation with alfaifa and annual forages, they have in-creased both productivity and organic matter on their crop-land.
