On April 27, 2007, TransCanada Keystone Pipeline, LP (Keystone) filed a siting permit application for the South Dakota portion of the Keystone Pipeline Project (Project). The Project will transport crude oil starting in Hardisty, Alberta, Canada and ending in Patoka, Illinois. The proposed 30 inch diameter pipeline will have a nominal capacity of 435,000 barrels of oil per day (bpd) with a possible expansion to 591,000 bpd. The proposed route will enter South Dakota at the North Dakota/South Dakota border in Marshall County and extend in a southerly direction, exiting the state at the South Dakota/Nebraska border in Yankton County. The length of the pipeline in South Dakota will be approximately 220 miles and it will cross the counties of Marshall, Day, Clark, Beadle, Kingsbury, Miner, Hanson, McCook, Hutchinson and Yankton. The Project also includes four pump stations in South Dakota located in Day, Beadle, Miner and Hutchinson counties along with 15 mainline valves with an average spacing of 15 miles between valves.

The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapter 49-41B and ARSD Chapter 20:10:22.

Pursuant to SDCL 49-41B-15 and 49-41B-16, the Commission will hold public hearings on Keystone's application at the following times and places:

Monday, June 25, 2007: 7:00 p.m. CDT at Joe's Café, 1150 Spruce, Alexandria, SD

Tuesday, June 26, 2007: 7:00 p.m. CDT at Clark Community Center, 120 N. Commercial St., Clark, SD

Wednesday, June 27, 2007: Noon CDT at Marshall County Community Building, 909 South Main, Britton, SD

The purpose of the hearings will be to hear public comment regarding Keystone's application. At the public input hearings, Keystone will present a brief description of the project, following which interested persons may appear and present their views, comments and questions regarding the application. A copy of the application is on file in the following counties: Marshall County, Day County, Clark County, Beadle County, Kingsbury County, Miner County, Hanson County, McCook County, Hutchinson County and Yankton County pursuant to SDCL 49-41B-15(5). The application is also on file in the Commission's office in the Capitol Building in Pierre, and the application and all other documents in the case may be accessed on the Commission's web site at www.puc.sd.gov under "Commission Actions," "Commission Dockets," "2007 Hydrocarbon Pipeline," "HP07-001."

Pursuant to SDCL 49-41B-17 and ARSD 20:10:22:40, the parties to this proceeding are currently Keystone and the Commission. Further, each municipality, county, and governmental agency in the area where the facility is proposed to be sited; any non-profit organization, formed in whole or in part to promote conservation or natural beauty, to protect the environment, personal health or other biological values, to preserve historical sites, to promote consumer interests, to represent commercial and industrial groups, or to promote the orderly development of the area in which the facility is to be sited; or any interested person, may be granted party status in this proceeding by making written application to the Commission. Applications for party status will be available at the public input hearings or may be obtained from the Commission's web site or by contacting the Commission. Applications for party status must be received by the Commission on or before June 26, 2007, unless the deadline is extended by the Commission.

Following the public input hearings, the Commission may schedule one or more subsequent formal evidentiary hearings conforming to SDCL Chapter 1-26 to consider any issues raised by any intervening party, Commission Staff or the Commission itself. At such formal hearing, all parties will have the opportunity to appear, present evidence and cross-examine the other parties' witnesses and exercise all other rights afforded by SDCL Chapters 1-26, 49-1 and 49-41B and ARSD 20:10:01 and 20:10:22. Absent a contested issue, the Commission will schedule the matter for decision at a regular or special meeting of the Commission.

For approval, Keystone must show that the proposed facility will comply with all applicable laws and rules, will not pose a threat of serious injury to the environment nor to the social and economic condition of inhabitants or expected inhabitants in the siting area, will not substantially impair the health, safety or welfare of the inhabitants, and will not unduly interfere with the orderly development of the region with due consideration having been given to the views of governing bodies of affected local units of government. Based upon these factors, the Commission will decide whether the permit should be granted, denied or granted upon such terms, conditions or modifications of the construction, operation or maintenance as the Commission finds appropriate.

The parties will have the right to appeal the final decision in this case to the appropriate Circuit Court by serving and filing a notice of appeal of the decision in accordance with SDCL 1-26-31, within thirty (30) days after the date of service of the notice of entry of decision in this case.

It is therefore

ORDERED, that pursuant to SDCL 49-41B-17.1, a party may receive all material filed in this matter by making a specific request to the Commission for personal service of the material. Absent such a specific request, the County Auditor for the previously listed counties is the designated agent for service of process upon all other parties to this proceeding; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that the Commission shall hold public input hearings on the following dates and times:

FURTHER ORDERED, pursuant to SDCL 49-41B-17 and ARSD 20:10:22:40, that applications for party status be filed within 60 days from the date Keystone's application was filed with the Commission. Therefore, an application for party status must be filed with the Commission on or before June 26, 2007.
