MidAmerican Energy Company provides the following information in response to Vanuassa Cobb's Complaint filed on July 26, 1997, by Susan Cobb, concerning gas service to an underage customer. In the Complaint, Susan Cobb states her daughter, Vanesa Cobb, "went down and had the utility put in her name" and continued on to state "my daughter told them she was almost 18 when she had this done." She states her daughter is semployed and she is not. Susam Cobb also explains she has been trying to hide from Clifford Makins since 1996 and has been putting everything in Vancesa's name to slow Clifford down from finding them. In addition, Ms. Cobb also states her daughter will be 18 in less than 3 weeks. As a resolution remedy, Susan Cobb requests MidAmerican stop the disconnect scheduled for June 27, indicating when her daughter is 18 the service will remain in Vanesas' aname.

MidAmerican's record show on February 27, 1997, an application for service for Vanessa Cobb was entered by a Sioux City call center employee, not a customer office representative in Sioux Falls. This application indicates Vanessa is single and a student, and that Susan Cobb, mother of Vanessa, also occupies the premise. Listed as employer for Susan Cobb is "daycare."

Subsequent to the application, MidAmerican learned Vanessa is a minor. MidAmerican notes that this was confirmed by Susan Cobb in this Complaint. MidAmerican does not knowingly contract with an unemancipated minor for utility service. Consequently, MidAmerican delivered a notice of disconnection to the premise on June 24, 1997. At the time the notice was delivered, our representative was advised by Susan Cobb that Vanessa would be in to the Stoux Falls office on June 25, 1997 with picture identification. Vanessa Cobb has not visited our office since our conversation with her mother.

On June 26, 1997, Ms. Cobb filed this Complaint. To cooperate in this matter, MidAmerican delayed the immediate disconnection order. However, we now find the account to be in default of a May 21, 1997 deferred payment arrangement and is subject to disconnection. In accordance with the arrangement, a payment of \$27.00 plus the current bill was to have been made on June 19, 1997. No payments have been received on the account since a down payment of \$40.00 on the payment arrangement was made on June 2, 1997. The disconnection of gas service is scheduled for July 17, 1997.

Further account research also shows Susan "Makins" Cobb, currently has an outstanding debt with MidAmerican of \$58.74 as well as two outstanding debts usualing over \$1000.00 which are protected by a bankruptry action. Susan "Makins" Cobb would not have been able to establish service with MidAmerican in February 1997 without payment of her past due bill of \$58,74 and a deposit.

For Vanessa Cobb to avoid disconnection or to reestablish service following disconnection, it is necessary for her to prove she is 18 year old or older, pay Susan's past due bill of 558 74, pay the outstanding debt under Vanessa's name, pay a deposit, and pay a reconnection fee. For Susan to reestablish service with MidAmerican it is necessary for her to pay the outstanding debt in Vanessa's name, Susan's debt of 558 74, and pay a deposit.

IN THE MATTER OF THE COMPLAINT FILED DRD BY SUSAN COBB, SIOUX FALLS, SD, PRO AGAINST MIDAMERICAN ENERGY COMPANY DISMIS REGARDING DISCONNECTION AND C

ORDER FINDING NO PROBABLE CAUSE, DISMISSING COMPLAINT AND CLOSING DOCKET NG97-010

On June 25, 1997, the South Dakota Public Unitires Commission (Commission) received a complaint from Susan Cobb (Cobb). Sioux Falls, SD, against MidAmerican Energy Company (MidAmerican) regarding disconnection. Cobb stated that the utilities were put in her daughter's name because she was the only one working. Further, Cobb states that her daughter was almost 18 when this was done and that in less than three weeks from the time the complaint was filed her daughter would turn 18. Subsequent to the application, MidAmerican learned the daughter was a minor. Consequently, a disconnection oftew was delivered in the complaint, Cobb requested that disconnection be stopped. In response, MidAmerican delayed the immediate disconnection order. After the disconnection delay, MidAmerican found the account to be in default of a May 21, 1997 deferred payment arrangement. In accordance with the arrangement, a payment plus the current bill was to have been made on June 19, 1997. No payments have been made on the account since the down payment was made on June 2, 1997. Therefore, the account was subject to disconnection.

On July 15, 1997, at its duly noticed meeting, the Commission reviewed the complaint as well as comments of MidAmerican. Ms. Cobb did not appear.

The Commission finds that it has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapter 49-34A and ARSD 20 10 01 08 01 and 20 10 01 09

The Commission found that the disconnection notice for the default account made the original disconnection a moot point. The Commission unanimously voted to find no probable cause of an unlawful or unreasonable act, rate, practice or omission on the part of MidAmenican and to dismiss the Complaint and close the docket. As the Commission's final decision in this matter, it is therefore.

ORDERED, that the Commission does not find probable cause of an unlawful or unreasonable act, rate, practice or omission and therefore the Complaint is dismissed and docket NG97-010 is hereby closed.
