


Arrived post SQ1 (E1 apparatus) to find small excavator which had struck an unmarked metal natural gas line. Severed gas line is found to be on South side of alley/sidewalk near 920 11th St. SQ1 reports small amount of hissing gas coming from area and believes it to be a one inch pipe. Winds are mild out of the North. SQ1 made contact with the two residential structures to the North and South of 920 11th St to advise of the gas leak. No answer at 920 11th St, but a dog was noted to be in the home. MDU had been contacted by dispatch with a 30 minute ETA. MDU arrived on scene and was briefed by SQ1. Resident of 920 11th did arrive on scene and was informed of incident per SQ1. Resident entered home to walk his dog before returning to work with no reports of obvious gas issues noted within structure reported. After walking his dog resident returned, placed dog within home and returned to work.

Investigate per SQ1. M2 response cancelled per BC1. Intersection of 11th/Columbus blocked by SQ1 with intersection of 11th/South blocked by BC1. HZ6 dispatched immediate for air monitoring around structures. E6 out of station during dispatch but had air monitors available. E6 arrived on scene but before air monitoring could occur E6 released to assist with confirmed structure at landfill. After arrival of MDU BC1 cleared scene to assist on reported MVC with possible structure involvement on the...



MVC with structure unfounded per FR3 and BC1 began return to gas incident. While enroute, SQ1 requested structure fire response for ignition of gas line with fire exposure to 920 11th St. BC1 staged in intersection of 11th/Columbus and initiated "Columbus Command". All incoming resources advised to use Fireground 2. SQ1 actively extinguishing fire to area of gas line rupture and exposure to Alpha side of home. E4 instructed to perform 360 of structure then enter home to look for possible fire extension/primary search. FR3 instructed to provide back up for E4. E5 arrived with two personnel and instructed to establish RIT on Alpha side. Initial report of "two dogs" within home per resident who was found outside. Resident states he was not at home during incident. Resident later confirms only one dog within home with no other life safety issues noted. Chief Carlson arrived on scene and assisted with fire ground operations including water supply to SQ1. Exterior gas meter shut secured per RCFD crews. Electrical secured per BHP. RCPD requested to assist with traffic control. During operations it was noted by Chief Carlson that the first floor, wood frame wall on the Delta side was bowing out. Upon receipt of information all interior crews were instructed to evacuate for possible defensive attack due to structure issues. All resources advised that fire attack would be defensive with PAR performed and all resources removed from building. FR3 and E4 cut access hole to wooden flooring directly inside of Bravo doorway and were able to gain access to fire and extinguish. Primary/secondary searches to both floors, salvage/overhaul completed per SQ1. SQ1 assisted resident with removal of personal belongings to Alpha side. Plastic placed on windows per SQ1 with doors secured. Homeowner denied any further need for RCFD and gave verbal permission to re-evaluate home later in shift for any continued fire activity. Resident initially refused any assistance from Red Cross but later changed mind. Red Cross contacted per dispatch but was unable to have any person physically respond. BC1 assisted Red Cross representative Julie from St. Paul with resident verification and contact information. Resident advised that Red Cross would not be able to respond to scene but would contact him shortly with assistance. Resident acknowledged and denied any further need for assistance from RCFD. MDU remained on scene and denied any further need for RCFD.

Primary/secondary searches to both floors, salvage/overhaul completed per SQ1. SQ1 assisted resident with removal of personal belongings to Alpha side. Plastic placed on windows per SQ1 with doors secured. Homeowner denied any further need for RCFD and gave verbal permission to re-evaluate home later in shift for any continued fire activity. Resident initially refused any assistance from Red Cross but later changed mind. Red Cross contacted per dispatch but was unable to have any person physically respond. BC1 assisted Red Cross representative Julie from St. Paul with resident verification and contact information. Resident advised that Red Cross would not be able to respond to scene but would contact him shortly with assistance. Resident acknowledged and denied any further need for assistance from RCFD. MDU remained on scene and denied any further need for RCFD.

Fr-3 dispatched to above address for a report of a structure fire Crew in area prior do to a under ground gas line that was damaged do to construction. on arrival Fr-3 noted two sides of a single story wood frame home with garden basement smoke noted through multiple openings. command assigned Fr-3 attack with E-4 crew.

-Fire attack-

Crews were dispatched to the above address earlier in the day for a report of a underground gas line that was damaged do to construction, crews on arrival reported one inch line free flowing gas and requested MDU. see Sq-1 report for details on actions taken.

Fr-3 seen two sides of a type 5 wood single story residential home with garden basement windows. smoke noted through multiple openings and along the roof vents. Fr-3 noted delta side was bowed out do to possible explosions.

Fr-3 used a 1 3/4 green 200' reconnect hose off on Sq-1- [E-1] and advanced it to the Alfa side front door. Fr-3 officer and E-4 officer preformed 360. E-4 enter the structure on the Alfa side and was quickly evacuated by command. fr-3 reassigned utility control.

-Utility's assignment-

Fr-3 found gas meter on the bravo side with Sq-1 working to turn off gas meter it was noted crew needed MDU key. MDU located and Sq-1 able to turn off gas.

-Transitional attack assignment-

Fr-3 assigned transitional attack. Fr-3 crews used green 1 3/4 hose off Sq-1 to flow water into the windows on the Alfa side. Fr-3 noted a improvement in condition Fr-3 communicated with command and preformed a assessment of the attic space. no fire noted in attic.

-Primary search-

command requested a primary search. Fr-3 found dog in the front living room area behind couch. no other soles found on the main floor.

command cleared Fr-3

MM1 responded cold to the call location for structure fire medical standby. MM1 assisted with FF rehab. MM1 cleared without incident.

Apparatus Narrative for SQD1:

L- Squad 1, BC1 and M2 were dispatched emergent to the area of Columbus and 11th St. for a struck gas line from a construction company.

C- Gas Line Struck resulting into an explosion then structure fire.

H- Squad 1 arrived on scene and spoke with the contractor (Pike at Play) about what happened and stated that he was digging with a mini-excavator near the residence at 920 11th St. when he struck a 1" MDU service line with his equipment. Contractor stated that the area was located and marked prior to digging. Contractor also stated that he called MDU right after the line was struck.

Dispatch noted around 0945 that they called MDU and was awaiting a call back with an ETA. At around 1003 dispatch noted that MDU called back with a 30min ETA. MDU arrived around 1038 and began to assess the incident. Around 1100 there was an explosion in the residence at 920 11th St. and a large gas fed structure fire in the basement and also outside on the A&B side of the structure. Squad 1 requested a full structure response to the area for a confirmed structure fire.

A- Squad 1 arrived initially around 0943 and noted small hole near the residence at 920 11th St. with a mini-excavator sitting next to the hole. Squad 1 spoke with the contractor and got the story of what happened and asked if anyone was injured. Contractor stated that he was fine and his crew was fine. Contractor stated that he had not made contact with anyone at the residence of 920 11th St., however noted that there was 1 dog in the residence that was accessing a deck on the (B) side of the structure through a doggy door. Squad 1 attempted to make contact with anyone in the residence with no success. Squad 1 also made contact with the next closest residence downwind (south) and noted that residences did not want to evacuate, however stated they would remain inside and close all doors and windows. Squad 1 noted the wind was light and variable out of the NW. While speaking face-to-face with BC1 a person walked past the location and walked into the house at 920 11th St. Squad 1 crew made contact with the resident and stated to close all doors and windows and not stay in the residence. He stated he was going to let the dog out to use the restroom then put her back in. While in the residence, the residence except right at the front door. Resident left and closed all doors and windows. MDU and Squad 1 and ELM location services were at the scene and formulating a plan of repair when the house had an explosion and then the yard adjacent caught fire along with the basement had a fire under the kitchen area.

R-Squad 1 pulled a 1 3/4" attack line and began to attack the fire inside the residence utilizing a defensive tacti c. Squad 1 officer (Kusser) requested a full structure fire response for a confirmed structure fire. Squad 1 assigned resources to fire attack and water supply until BC1 arrived on scene and established command. Squad 1 had the tailboard begin fire attack and Squad 1 officer attempted to locate and rescue the dog inside of the residence by opening the (A) side front door. Squad 1 was unsuccessful at rescuing the dog at that time. Squad 1 officer performed a 360 of the structure and noted heavy smoke at the (A&B) basement window with laminar smoke at the (A&D) basement window. Squad 1 noted all upstairs windows to be blown outward. Squad 1 and E5 were able to shut the natural gas supply off at the meter on the (B) side under the deck. Squad 1 continued exterior fire attack and prevented the fire from getting larger on the exterior to the north towards another residence. Squad 1 was assigned to go interior after the fire was suppressed to check for any extension or hot spots. Squad 1 made access from the basement window on the (D) side and noted a small area in the basement near the stairs and below the kitchen to have heavy charring and fire damage, however the fire was out. Squad 1 returned outside then entered the upstairs through the (A) side doorway and noted no fire extension into the main level or into the attic space. Squad 1 assisted the homeowner in removing personal belongings out into the front yard. Squad 1 performed salvage and overhaul and secured the residence with plastic over the windows.

T- Squad 1 was cleared by Command and Squad 1 returned to station 1 to rehab the engine and equipment. Squad 1 cleared and returned to service.
