

On April 15, 1997, at a regularly scheduled meeting, the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) opened a docket in order to study the problems associated with the practice of long distance resellers ope uting within the state of South Dakota without an identifying PIC number. On May 8, 1997, the Commission electronically transmitted notice of the filing and the intervention deadline of May 23, 1997, to interested individuals and entities. Telecommunications Resellers Association, the South Dakota Independent Telephone Coalition, Inc., AT&T Communications of the Midwest, Inc., and MCI Telecommunications Corporation were granted intervention on June 3, 1997.

The Commission has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapte's 1-26, 49-13 and 49-31.

At a regularly scheduled meeting of December 2, 1997, Commission Staff updated the Commission as to its findings. Basically it was discovered that the practice of long distance resellers operating within the state of South Dakota without an identifying PIC number was a problem that can only be resolved at the federal level. Based on this, Commission Staff recommended that the docket be closed. The Commission voted to close the docket. It is therefore

ORDERED that docket TC97-050 is hereby closed.
