The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapters 1-26 and 49-31, including 1-26-18, 1-26-19, 49-31-3, 49-31-7.1, 49-31-7.1, and 47 U.S.C. § 214(e)(1) through (5).

The issues at the hearing shall be as follows: (1) whether the above captioned telecommunications companies should be granted designation as eligible telecommunications carriers, and (2) what service areas shall be established by the Commission.

A hearing shall be held at 1:30 P.M., on Tuesday, December 2, 1997, in Room 464, State Capitol, Pierre, South Dakota. It shall be an adversary proceeding conducted pursuant to SDCL Chapter 1:26. All parties have the right to be present and to be represented by an attomey. These rights and other due process rights shall be forfeited if not exercised at the hearing. If you or your representative fail to appear at the time and place set for the hearing, the Final Decision will be based solely on the testimony and evidence provided, if any, during the hearing or a Final Decision will be based solely on the testimony and evidence provided, if any, during the hearing or a Final Decision may be issued by default pursuant to SDCL 1-26-20. After the hearing, the Commission will consider all evidence and testimony that was presented at the hearing. The Commission will then enter hearing, the Commission may either grant or deny the request from any of the above captioned telecommunications companies requesting designation as an eligible telecommunications carriers. The Commission's decision may be appealed by the parties to the state Circuit Court and the state Supreme Court as provided by law. It is therefore

- I believe the one for column under Chevenne River Sioux Tribe Telephone Authority, I believe it's correct as stated. But the Commission has requested 12 further information from CRST, specifically from the 13 manager, J. D. Williams, which would clarify the toll control and the CRST's intent to implement Lifeline. 15 Link Up.
- MR. HOSECK: Okay. With that correction, or 17 with that clarification, I would move Staff Exhibit No. 18 1 into the record.

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- Q. And with regarding the designating of a service area, was there a response from the applicants on that issue?
- A. Yes. The Respondents -- or the applicants stated the exchanges and the prefixes where the ETC request would apply.
- Q. And with regard to the advertising of services that might be available on an exchange-wide basis, did the applicants address that issue?
- A. Yes. The applicants stated that they would be willing to advertise on a going-forward basis in accordance with any specific advertising standards that the Commission may develop. The CRST states that they are advertising presently in media of general distribution in their service area.
- Q. Based upon your review of these facts as represented by these applicants, in your opinion, have the applicants presented the facts necessary for the Commission to decide this ETC designation?

Q. Okay. And with regard to advertising services exchange-wide, do you have a recommendation to the Commission for a provision to be included in an order which would come out of these proceedings?

A. Yes.

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- Q. And what is that recommendation?
- A. That the telephone companies advertise their rates annually or whenever a rate changes.
- Q. And, finally, do you have an opinion as to whether or not the applicants qualify for an ETC designation?
- A. Yes, I believe they do, with the caveat again
  on CRST receiving -- the Commission receiving
  additional information.
- MR. HOSECK: I have no further questions of this witness.
- 18 MS. WIEST: Any questions? Any further
  19 witnesses?
- 20 MR. HOSECK: No further witnesses. Staff

Consolidated Telephone Cooperative, Dickinson, North Dakota, pursuant to 47 United States Code Section 214(e), and 47 Code of Federal Regulations Section 54.201 hereby seeks from the Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") designation as an "Eligible Telecommunications Carrier" within the local exchange area that constitutes its service area in South Dakota. In support of this request, Consolidated Telephone Cooperative offers the following:

- 1. Pursuant to 47 U.S.C. Section 214(e), it is the Commission's responzibility to designate local exchange carriers ("LECs") as "eligible telecommunications carriers" ("ETC"), or in other words, to determine which LECs have assumed universal service obligations consistent with the federal law and should be deemed eligible to receive federal universal service support. At least one eligible telecommunications carrier is to be designated by the Commission for each service area in the State. However, in the case of areas served by "rural telephone companies", the Commission may not designate more than one LEC as an ETC without first finding that such additional designation would be in the public interest. Under 47 C.F.R., Section 54.201, beginning January 1, 1998, only telecommunications carriers within their service area will be eligible to receive federal universal service support.
- Consolidated Telephone Cooperative is the facilities based local exchange carrier presently providing local exchange telecommunications services in the following exchange in South Dakota:

In the ordinary course of business the number of access lines are subject to change. Consolidated Telephone Cooperative, to its knowledge, is the only carrier today providing local exchange telecommunications service in the above exchange area.

- 3. Consolidated Telephone Cooperative, in accord with 47 C.F.R., Section 54.101, offers the following local exchange telecommunications services to all customers throughout its service area:
  - Voice grade access to the public switched network;
  - Local exchange service including an amount of local usage free of per minutes charges under a flat rated local service package;
  - Dual tone multi-frequency signaling;
  - Access to emergency service such as 911 or enhanced 911 public services;
  - Access to operator services;
  - Access to interexchange service;
  - Access to directory assistance; and
  - Toll blocking service to qualified low-income customers and all others.

As noted above, Consolidated Telephone Cooperative does provide toll limitation service in the form of toll blocking to qualified members, however, the additional toll limitation service of "toll control" as defined in the new FCC universal service rules (47 C.F.R., Section 54.400(3)) is not provided. Consolidated Telephone Cooperative is not aware that any local exchange carrier in South Dakota has a current capability to provide such service. The FCC gave no indication prior to the release of its universal service order (FCC 97-157) that toll control would be imposed as an ETC service requirement and, to our information and belief, as a result, LEC's nationwide are not positioned to make the service immediately available. In order for Consolidated Telephone

Cooperative to provide the service, additional usage tracking and storage capabilities will have to be installed in its local switching equipment. At minimum, the service requires a switching software upgrade and at this time, Consolidated Telephone Cooperative is investigating and attempting to determine whether the necessary software has been developed and when it might become available.

Accordingly, Consolidated Telephone Cooperative is faced with exceptional circumstances concerning the ability to make the toll control service available as set forth in the FCC's universal service rules and must request a waiver from the requirement to provide such service. At this time, a waiver is requested. The Commission may properly grant a waiver from the "toll control" requirement pursuant to 47 C.F.R., Section 54.101(c).

- 4. Consolidated Telephone Cooperative has previously and will continue to advertise the availability of its local exchange services in media of general distribution throughout the exchange area served. Prior to this filing, Consolidated Telephone Cooperative has not generally advertised the prices charged for all of the above identified services. It will do so going forward in accord with any specific advertising standards that the Commission may develop.
- 5. Pursuant to 47 C.F.R., Section 54.101(a)(4), Single Party Service is being offered by Consolidated Telephone Cooperative to all customers in the South Dakota telephone exchange. Beginning January 1, 1998, Lifeline and Link Up service will be offered under new terms in accord with the FCC rules, 47 C.F.R., Sections 54.400 and 54.417, and any South Dakota Public Utilities Commission decisions concerning implementation of the expanded programs.
- $\,$  6. Based on the foregoing, Consolidated Telephone Cooperative respectfully requests that the Commission:
  - (a) Grant a waiver of the requirement to provide "toll control" service; and
  - (b) Grant an ETC designation to Consolidated Telephone

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Cooperative covering all of the local exchange area that constitutes its present service area in the State.

FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, ORDER AND NOTICE OF ENTRY OF ORDER TC97-185

On November 20, 1997, the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received a request for designation as an eligible telecommunications carrier (ETC) from Consolidated Telephone Cooperative (Consolidated Telephone). Consolidated Telephone requested designation as an eligible telecommunications carrier within the local exchange areas that constitute its service area.

The Commission electronically transmitted notice of the filing and the intervention deadline to interested individuals and entities. No person or entity filed to intervene. By order dated November 21, 1997, the Commission set the hearing for this matter for 1:30 p.m. on December 2, 1997, in Room 464, State Capitol, Pierre, South Dakota.

The hearing was held as scheduled. At the hearing, the Commission granted Consolidated Theobrone a one year waiver of the requirement to provide toll control service within its service area. At its December 11, 1997, meeting, the Commission granted ETC designation to Consolidated Telephone and designated its study area as its service area.

Based on the evidence of record, the Commission enters the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

1

On November 20, 1997, the Commission received a request for designation as an ETC from Consolidated Telephone. Consolidated Telephone requested designation as an ETC within the local exchange areas that constitute its service area. Consolidated Telephone serves the following exchanges in South Dakota: South Scranton (278); South Ladd (576), and South Reeder (855). Exhibit 1.

Ш

Pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 214(e)(2), the Commission is required to designate a common carrier that meets the requirements of section 214(e)(1) as an ETC for a service area designated by the Commission.

111

Pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 214(e)(1), a common parier that is designated as an ETC is eligible to receive universal service support and shall, throughout its service area, offer the services that are supported by federal universal service support mechanisms either using its own facilities or a combination of its own facilities and resale of another carrier's services. The carrier must also advertise the availability of such services and the rates for the services using media of general distribution.

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has designated the following services or functionalities as those supported by federal universal service support mechanisms: (1) voice grade access to the public switched network; (2) local usage; (3) dual tone multi-frequency signaling or its functional equal; (4) single party service or its functional equivalent; (5) access to emergency services; (6) access to interexchange service; (8) access to directory assistance; and (9) toll limitation for qualifying low-income consumers. 47 C.F.R. § 54. 101(a)

Consolidated Telephone offers voice grade access to the public switched network to all consumers throughout its service area. Exhibit 1.

Consolidated Telephone offers local exchange service including an amount of local usage free of per minute charges to all consumers throughout its service area. Id.

VII

Consolidated Telephone offers dual tone multi-frequency signaling to all consumers throughout its service area.  $\underline{Id}$ .

IV

Consolidated Telephone offers single party service to all consumers throughout its service area.  $\underline{\text{Id}}$ .

X

Consolidated Telephone offers access to emergency services to all consumers throughout its service area. Id.

Х

Consolidated Telephone offers access to operator services to all consumers throughout its service area. Id.

XII

Consolidated Telephone offers access to interexchange services to all consumers throughout its service area. Id.

XIII

Consolidated Telephone offers access to directory assistance to all consumers throughout its service area. Id.

One of the services required to be provided by an ETC to qualifying low-income consumers stoll limitation. 47 C.F.R. § 54.101(a)(9). Toll limitation consists of both toll blocking and toll control. 47 C.F.R. § 54.400(1). Toll control is a service that allows consumers to specify a certain amount of toll usage that may be incurred per month or per billing cycle. 47 C.F.R. § 54.400(c). Toll blocking is a service that lets consumers elect not to allow the completion of outgoing toll calls. 47 C.F.R. § 54.400(b).

#### XV

Consolidated Telephone offers toll blocking to all consumers throughout its service area. Exhibit 1.

#### XVI

Consolidated Telephone does not currently offer toll control. Id. In order for Consolidated Telephone to provide toll control, additional usage tracking and storage capabilities will have to be installed in its local switching equipment. Consolidated Telephone is attempting to determine whether the necessary software has been developed and when it might become available. Id.

#### XVI

Consolidated Telephone stated that it is faced with exceptional circumstances concerning its ability to make toll control service available and requested a waiver from the requirement to provide such service. [g.

#### XVIII

With respect to the obligation to advertise the availability of services supported by the federal universal service support mechanism and the charges for those services using media of general distribution, Consolidated Telephone stated that it advertises the availability of its local exchange services in media of general distribution throughout its service area. However, Consolidated Telephone has not generally advertised the prices for these services. [c]. Consolidated Telephone stated its intention to comply with any advertising standards developed by the Commission. [d].

#### XIX

Consolidated Telephone currently does not offer Lifeline and Link Up service discounts in its exchanges. [d]. Consolidated Telephone will offer the Lifeline and Link Up service discounts in all of service area beginning January 1, 1998, in accordance with 47 C.F.R. §§ 54.400 to 54.417, inclusive. and any Commission imposed requirements. Id.

#### XX

The Commission finds that Consolidated Telephone currently provides and will continue to provide the following services or functionalities throughout its service area: (1) oucle grade access to the public switched network; (2) local usage; (3) dual tone multi-frequency signaling; (4) single-party service; (5) access to emergency services; (6) access to operator services; (7) access to interexchange service; (8) access to directory assistance; and (9) toll blocking for qualifying low-income consumers.

The Commission finds that pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 54.101(c) it will grant Consolidated cleiphone a waiver of the requirement to offer toll control services until December 31, 1998. The Commission finds that exceptional circumstances prevent Consolidated Telephone from providing toll control at this time due to the difficulty in obtaining the necessary software upgrades to provide the service.

#### XXII

The Commission finds that Consolidated Telephone intends to provide Lifeline and Link Up programs to qualifying customers throughout its service area consistent with state and federal rules and orders.

#### XXIII

The Commission finds that Consolidated Telephone shall advertise the availability of the services supported by the federal universal service support mechanism and the charges therefor throughout its service area using media of general distribution once each year. The Commission further finds that if the rate for any of the services supported by the federal universal service support mechanism changes, the new rate must be advertised using media of general distributions.

#### XXIV

Pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 214(e)(5), the Commission designates Consolidated Telephone's current study area as its service area.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

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The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapters 1-26, 49-31, and 47 U.S.C.  $\S$  214.

Pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 214(e)(2), the Commission is required to designate a common carrier that meets the requirements of section 214(e)(1) as an ETC for a service area designated by the Commission.

Pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 54.101(c), the Commission concludes that Consolidated Telephone has demonstrated exceptional circumstances that justify granting it a waiver of the requirement to offer toll control until December 31, 1998.

VII

Consolidated Telephone shall provide Lifeline and Link Up programs to qualifying customers throughout its service area consistent with state and federal rules and orders.

VIII

Consolidated Telephone shall advertise the availability of the services supported by the federal universal service support mechanism and the charges therefor using media of general distribution once each year. If the rate for any of the services supported by the federal universal service support mechanism changes, the new rate shall be advertised using media of general distribution.

FURTHER ORDERED, that Consolidated Telephone shall follow the advertising requirements as listed above; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that Consolidated Telephone is designated as an eligible telecommunications carrier for its service area.
