Dear Mr. Best:

McCook Telecom, Inc. (McCook), by and through its undersigned attorney, hereby requests a waiver of the requirements of ARSD 20:10:27:07. This Rule states in part:

> Each carrier's carrier or association shall file an initial tariff for switched access service with the commission. Each carrier's carrier or association shall file cost data in support of its switched access service tariff no less than once every three years . . .

This waiver is requested for the following reasons:

1. On or about January 1, 2001, McCook acquired the telephone assets of Hanson Communications, Inc. (Hanson), which included the Salem and Alexandria exchanges (see letter of notification to PUC dated March 19, 2001, a copy of which is attached). One of the Hanson exchanges acquired by McCook was, prior to the transfer, an average schedule company. There is thus no cost data available for that exchange at the present time.

2. McCook is required to file cost data this year under the requirements of the above rule, but only for the Salem Exchange. McCook requests a waiver of the requirements of ARSD 20:10:27:07 for one year to enable McCook to file one cost study on behalf of all of its exchanges. The one-year delay would give McCook the opportunity to gather one year's data for the recently-acquired exchanges, and then to submit one cost study based on accurate data from all of its exchanges. In addition, it would be more economical for McCook to submit one cost study that includes all of its exchanges, rather than filing for only the Salem Exchange. Harlan Best April 5, 2001 Page 2

For these reasons, McCook respectfully requests that the Commission grant the company a waiver of the requirement to file cost data, as required by ARSD 20:10:27:07, for a period of one year.
