### 3. How The Company is implementing the new certification procedures

NECA Services (NSI) will administer the Federal Lifeline/Link-up Program rules on behalf of Golden West and its subsidiary companies in accordance with 47 C.F.R. Part 54, effective June 15, 2005. NSI will assist The Company in developing new applications and forms (See attached).

NSI will field and respond to questions regarding Lifeline/Link-up assistance and eligibility.

NSI will process applications ensuring that the subscribers have accurately completed, signed and provided the required documentation.

NSI will enter all application information into a Company specific Lifeline Database.

NSI will post a daily enrollment/rejection file to a secure FTP site for The Company.

## 4. How The Company is implementing the new verification procedures

NSI will work with The Company to determine the size of the verification, which will be at a minimum, a statistically valid sample of Lifeline consumers. The statistically valid sample will be based upon the guidelines as described in Appendix J of Report and Order FCC 04-87.

NSI will print and mail verification letters and return forms to the selected subscribers (See attached).

NSI will process returned verification requests and ensure that the selected subscribers have accurately completed and signed the verification documents and provided the required documentation.

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Verifications will be posted to a secure FTP site for The Company.

NSI will retain all Lifeline/Link-up documentation for as long as NSI administers the Federal Lifeline/Link-up Program for The Company.

The Company will send a letter to the Universal Service Administrative Company certifying that verification procedures are in place (see attached).
