ANSWER OF YMAX COMMUNICATIONS CORP. TO AT&T PETITION TO INTERVENE

YMax Communications Corp. (YMax), pursuant to ARSD Section 20:10:01:15:04, answers the Petition to Intervene filed by AT&T Communications of the Midwest, Inc. (AT&T) as follows:

- 1. YMax is a foreign corporation and a registered Competitive Local Exchange Carrier (CLEC) authorized to do business in South Dakota. YMax's corporate headquarters is located at 5700 Georgia Ave., West Palm Beach, FL 33405.
- 2. YMax disputes the allegations set forth in paragraphs 4-5 of AT&T's Petition.
- 3. In support of its Answer, YMax states as follows:

YMax's tariff filing was submitted in compliance with the Federal Communications Commission Report and Order in WC Docket No. 10-90, etc., FCC No. 11-161 (released Nov 18, 2011) ("CAF Order") regarding the application of access charges to Toll VoIP-PSTN traffic and rate levels for intrastate switched access service. AT&T has filed protests and/or petitions to intervene regarding similar YMax tariff filings in other states, including Colorado, Maryland, Ohio, Maine, Georgia, Alabama, North Dakota and others. YMax has responded to the flawed arguments raised by AT&T in responses filed in Maryland and in Rhode Island and in a June 21, 2012 letter to the FCC. All three of those responses are attached hereto and offered as a response to AT&T's Petition. Also attached is a Notice of Ex Parte Communication filed with the FCC on behalf of Level 3 Communications, LLC and Bandwidth.com, Inc., which likewise disputes the positions taken by AT&T in its Complaint.

4. YMax requests that the Commission allow the tariff to go into effect as filed, as suspension of the tariff based on allegations in AT&T's Petition is unwarranted and would simply continue AT&T's misrepresentation of the recent FCC order that the attached communications to the Maryland PSC, the

Rhode Island PUC and the FCC describe and would permit AT&T to avoid paying lawful access charges.

AT&T's challenge of YMax's tariff is nothing more than a transparent attempt to evade paying access

charges associated with intercarrier toll VoIP-PSTN traffic, despite the FCC's explicit decision in the

CAF Order that Local Exchange Carriers may tariff such charges, through both federal and state tariffs,

and be compensated for such traffic. This is exactly the kind of gamesmanship, evasion, and arbitrage

that the FCC was trying to stop in the CAF Order. The FCC sought to promote certainty and equity by

ensuring that both TDM carriers and IP-based carriers were treated equally and subject to the same

intercarrier compensation rules. AT&T itself is one of the very largest VoIP providers that originates and

terminates calls "over the top."

AT&T is talking out of both sides of its mouth, because its ILECs continue to bill and collect

switched access charges from other carriers for calls using "over the top" VoIP to different subsidiaries it

owns. AT&T's subsidiaries are even separately certificated. It uses both femtocells/microcells to carry

wireless traffic over its customers' ISP/Internet "over the top" too. To take this a step further, AT&T

switches the same customers around its various subsidiaries to game the system and make a mockery of

what the FCC has done in access reform.
