RE: FiberComm Intrastate Switched Access Services Revised Tariff Pages

Dear Ms. Van Gerpen

Attached for electronic filing is the revised FiberComm tariff page to implement the Federal Communications Commission's Intercarrier Compensation Reform Order, FCC 11-161. The Order capped intrastate rates at December 29, 2011 levels and began a nine year transition to bill-and-keep for terminating access rates. As of July 1, 2012 companies will transition to terminating intrastate rates established through the rules contained in FCC 51.911, or one-half of the difference between the amount of revenue collect when the same demand is multiplied by both the interstate and intrastate capped rates.

FiberComm has elected to begin mirroring their interstate rates and rate structure with additional of a Transitional rate to be utilized until July 2013. FiberComm relied on 51.911 (b)(5) to calculate their Transitional Rate, along with DA 12-870 which allowed carriers to move to the interstate rate structure by increasing an intrastate rate element as long as the overall reduction principle was satisfied.

FiberComm has attached the calculation of the Transitional Rate as confidential since the calculation contains details about FiberComm's revenues and volumes of access minutes. FiberComm also attached a redacted version for public view of the methodology utilized to calculate the reduced intrastate terminating rates.

The FCC orders requiring the transition of terminating intrastate traffic to bill-and-keep create a difference between originating and terminating rates. Therefore FiberComm requests a waiver of 20:10:29:10, 20:10:29:12 and 20:10:29:16 for the provision that states "the per minute charge is equal for both originating and terminating traffic.

FiberComm has also included tariff revisions that were effective upon approval of the PUC's RM 05-002 docket.
