

Lettter and Other Information to Inform Existing and New Customers of the Availability of Lifeline/Link-up



April 30, 2012

Dear WRT Customer:

Lifeline, Tribal Link Up, and **Toll Blocking** is available from West River Telecom. These programs provide discounts to eligible low-income consumers to help them establish and maintain telephone service. **Note:** Telecommunications carriers cannot charge a Lifeline customer federal USF fees on the local service as a portion of their telephone bill.

What type of discount is available?

Lifeline assistance lowers the cost of basic, monthly local telephone service. Eligible consumers can receive at least \$8.25 per month in discounts.

Eligible residents of Indian reservations or tribal lands can receive \$21.95 in Lifeline support, but must pay at least \$1 for basic monthly service.

Tribal Link Up reduces the cost of initiating new telephone service to qualifying consumers residing on Tribal Lands and covers 100% of the charges (up to \$100) of the customary charge for commencing telecommunications service. Eligible consumers also qualify for a deferred payment schedule for remaining costs of up to \$200.

Toll Blocking support allows eligible consumers who wish to avoid incurring large long distance fees to choose toll blocking or toll control at no cost. Also, by choosing this option, consumers are usually not charged a deposit.

How do I know whether I am eligible?

An individual is eligible if he or she participates in one of the following programs:

- Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)
- Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA) or Section 8
- Medicaid
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)




