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To whom it may concern.

Re: Routing of E911 Calls from PureTalk Holdings, Inc. Wireless Services

AT&T Mobility ("Carrier") provides licensed facilities-based wireless services directly to all of its customers (both wholesale and retail) and routes 911 calls from such customers to the Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs) in accordance with applicable Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") enhanced 911 ("E911") legal requirements and pursuant to arrangements with PSAPs to receive such calls.

Carrier provides wholesale wireless service to PureTalk Holdings, Inc. ("PureTalk"), which resells such service to retail customers under its own brand, on prices, terms and conditions set by PureTalk. As a wholesale client of Carrier, PureTalk has asked Carrier to certify that its Lifeline customers will have access to 911 and E911 services that are compliant with all FCC rules and regulations applicable to facilities-based eligible telecommunications carriers ("ETCs"). In this regard, Carrier certifies that it routes 911 calls according to applicable FCC E911 requirements, and that it routes 911 calls from PureTalk customers to PSAPs in the identical manner as Carrier routes 911 calls from its own customers to PSAPs.

Carrier also certifies that it tests all handsets submitted to Carrier by PureTalk to ensure they are compatible with, and function correctly on, Carrier's network. Additionally, Carrier has engaged in 911 testing with PSAPs to confirm 911 and E911 access in accordance with applicable FCC requirements. Thus, as a resale client of Carrier, PureTalk customers have the identical access to 911 and E911 services as do Carrier's own customers.

Finally, calls placed by customers of wholesale clients such as PureTalk are transported and routed with the same service quality that Carrier provides its own retail customers. Carrier is unaware of any incident in its relationship with PureTalk where PureTalk customers faced a public safety risk as a result of a failure to correctly route emergency calls over Carrier's network.
