

- 3-1) Explain why the application in Nevada has been outstanding for over 7 years. Why has it not been approved or withdrawn?

Response: New Horizons' application in Nevada has not been outstanding for 7 years. The original application erroneously stated on pages 3 and 8 that they are certified in Nevada as of July, 2007. New Horizons currently has an application pending in Nevada, filed on June 2, 2014. New Horizons was previously certified in Nevada in 2007 under Docket No. C-3742. This certification was revoked in March, 2014 due to the late filing of a \$200 surcharge. New Horizons immediately addressed the issue that caused revocation and refiled for certificate. The application is currently pending.

- 3-2) Does the company have any other outstanding applications for Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity, interexchange service, or local exchange service in any other state? If so, when were those applications filed? Explain why the application has not been approved or withdrawn.

Response: New Horizons is pending in Oklahoma. The Oklahoma IXC&CLEC application was filed on September 4, 2013. New Horizons has not had any adverse issues throughout Oklahoma's application process and await the final hearing.

New Horizons is also pending in Kansas. The CLEC application was filed on August 15, 2014. Kansas has not yet processed the application.
