Dear Ms. Van Gerpen:

Sprint Communications Company, LP ("Sprint") pursuant to SDCL§ 49-31-3.1 hereby informs the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") that approximately 12 months from now, Sprint plans to discontinue an emerging competitive telecommunications service. At this time, Sprint plans to discontinue its provision of this service effective June 30, 2017, or as soon thereafter as the necessary regulatory approvals are obtained.

Contemporaneously with this letter, Sprint is filing with the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") its Application for Authorization to discontinue Sprint wireline business long distance services and associated features. Per FCC requirements, the Commission will receive service copies of this application from FCC Counsel in addition to the courtesy copy that has been attached with this letter.

Based on the classification of these services in South Dakota, South Dakota law requires notification to the Commission of discontinuance of this service. This letter is to serve as such notification. Sprint is providing notice to the Commission at this time because its contracts with some business wireline customers require 12-month advance notice. Contemporaneously with this notice, Sprint is also providing written notice to impacted customers. Attached hereto is a sample of the discontinuance letter required by the FCC that was sent to all impacted Sprint customers, including those in South Dakota.

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Consistent with Sprint's obligations as the Telecommunications Relay Service ("TRS") provider in South Dakota and other states, Sprint will continue to provide Casual Caller interexchange service to TRS users that are not pre-subscribed to any long distance provider. Such service is not part of the discontinuance.

### IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING DISCONTINUANCE OF SPRINT WIRELINE LEGACY VOICE LONG DISTANCE SERVICES

#### Account Number:

On June 30, 2017, or as soon thereafter as the necessary regulatory approvals can be obtained, Sprint Communications Company L.P. ("Sprint") will no longer provide Sprint wireline legacy voice long distance services and associated features in each of the 50 United States, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Due to changing market conditions, Sprint has determined that it should discontinue offering Sprint wireline business long distance voice services over legacy technology and focus on VoIP services. The specific Sprint wireline business legacy voice long distance services and associated features being discontinued include all domestic and international 1+ dialing from presubscribed accounts as well as WATS / ToII Free, Private Line, Switched Data Services, Operator Services, Directory Assistance, Directory Assistance Calling, FÖNCARD and all business pricing plans associated with the services listed above. This discontinuance does not impact any of the Sprint VoIP/IP equivalent services SIP Trunking, SIP ToII Free, SIP International ToII Free, IP, MPLS and Cloud Value Added Services or any of the services related to our Sprint wireless services.

If you are planning to migrate your WATS, Toll Free, Private Line and Switched Data Services to Sprint's VoIP/IP equivalent services of SIP Trunking and MPLS, please contact your Sprint Representative promptly to ensure your migration is completed by June 2017. Alternatively contact Sprint via email at business.customer.care@sprint.com, or via telephone at 844-492-4334 Monday — Friday 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. EST.

If you are not planning to migrate to a VoIP Sprint SIP Trunking IP/MPLS circuit, the discontinuance of the service will impact all of your Sprint 1+ (referred as pre-subscribed long distance carrier services) and the Sprint services listed above. If you choose to continue using a legacy voice TDM circuit from your local telephone service provider to access pre-subscribed long distance voice services, you will need to choose another long distance service provider. Note that a new service provider may require approximately three months to provision service to you. As a result, we strongly recommend that you select a provider no later than March 30, 2017. If you are not certain of your options for obtaining replacement pre-subscribed long distance service, you should contact your local telephone service provider and ask which carriers are accepting pre-subscribed customers. You may also contact any of the several companies that serve the business market in your area. An Internet search for "business telecommunications service providers" in your area should provide you with several alternatives. Sprint does not have the ability to select another provider for you. This discontinuance does not impact any of

the Sprint VoIP/IP equivalent services SIP Trunking, SIP Toll Free, SIP International Toll Free, IP, MPLS and Cloud Value Added Services or any of the services related to our Sprint wireless services.

Additionally, if you are a Toll Free customer not planning to migrate to Sprint's VoIP equivalent SIP Toll Free services, you must change your service provider **before June 30, 2017** to ensure that you can retain your current Toll Free Telephone Number with your new provider.

Sprint has notified the Federal Communications Commission of its proposed discontinuance of service. The FCC will normally authorize this proposed discontinuance of service (or reduction or impairment) unless it is shown that customers would be unable to receive service or a reasonable substitute from another carrier or that the public convenience and necessity is otherwise adversely affected. If you wish to object, you should file your comments as soon as possible, but no later than 15 days after the Commission releases public notice of the proposed discontinuance. You may file your comments electronically through the FCC's Electronic Comment Filing System using the docket number established in the Commission's public notice for this proceeding, or you may address them to the Federal Communications Commission, Wireline Competition Bureau, Competition Policy Division, 445 12<sup>th</sup> Street SW, Washington, DC 20554, and include in your comments a reference to the § 63.71 Application of Sprint Communications Company L.P. Comments should include specific information about the impact of this proposed discontinuance (or reduction or impairment) upon you or your company, including any inability to acquire reasonable substitute service.
