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COMES NOW, Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe Telephone Authority ("CRSTTA") a South Dakota Tribal Corporation, by and through the undersigned counsel, and requests pursuant to A.R.S.D. §§ 20:10:32:03 and 20:10:24:02 of the Public Utilities Commission's ("Commission") Administrative Rules, a certificate of authority and submits the following information in support thereof:

CRSTTA is a tribally owned business and was organized in 1958.

CRSTTA operates under Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe Ordinance 24 and its Charter and By-laws.

(6) A description of the applicant's experience providing any telecommunication services in South Dakota or in other jurisdictions, including the types of services provided, and the dates and nature of state or federal authorization to provide the services. (A.R.S.D §§ 20:10:32:03 (6)):

CRSTTA has been operating as a telecommunications provider for sixty years since 1958.

(7) Names and addresses of applicant's affiliates, subsidiaries, and parent organizations, if any. (A.R.S.D. §§ 20:10:32:03 (7)):

Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe: 100% owner

 - (a) Information indicating the classes of customers the applicant intends to serve.

Residential and business customers.

(b) Information indicating the extent to and time-frame by which applicant will provide service through the use of its own facilities, the purchase of unbundled network elements, or resale.

CRSTTA proposes to provide local service through the use of its own facilities. Construction is estimated to be completed in the summer/fall of 2019, which is the time-frame by which applicant will provide services.

(c) A description of all facilities that the applicant will utilize to furnish the proposed local exchange services, including any facilities of underlying carriers.

All services will be provided over CRSTTA's fiber-based facilities.

(d) Information identifying the types of services it seeks authority to provide by reference to the general nature of the service.

CRSTTA will provide local telephone exchange service, and interexchange long distance service and broadband to residential and business customers.

CRSTTA intends to offer its services initially in the territory now served by CenturyLink in the Timber Lake exchange. The Company will adhere to the service area maps defined by CenturyLink.

 - (a) A description of the education and experience of the applicant's management personnel who will oversee the proposed local exchange services.

Information explaining how the applicant will provide customers with access to emergency services such as 911 or enhanced 911, operator services, interexchange services, directory assistance, and telecommunications relay services. (A.R.S.D. §§ 20:10:32:03 (11)):

CRSTTA will connect with the Dewey County PSAP (PSAP ID 6125) via the 911 selective router and will provide enhanced 911 consistent with current E911 requirements. CRSTTA will contact the proper county officials and will provision and test E911 before offering any services. CRSTTA will use its provider for operator and directory assistance services. CRSTTA will configure its switch to provide and properly route all telecommunications relay services. CRSTTA will connect with the SDN Communications' tandem switch and utilize Express Communications to provide interexchange services. Both inter- and intrastate equal access will be provided.

CRSTTA anticipates negotiating the interconnection agreements concurrent with the processing of this application.
