APPLICATION OF VESTA SOLUTIONS, INC.

Vesta Solutions, Inc. ("Vesta" or "Applicant"), by its undersigned counsel and pursuant to Sections 20:10:32:03 and 20:10:24:02 of the Administrative Rules of South Dakota, hereby applies for a certificate of authority from the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") to provide local exchange services and interexchange long distance services in the state of South Dakota. Vesta submits the following information in support of this Application:

(2) A description of the legal and organizational structure of the applicant's company:

Applicant is a California corporation. A copy of Applicant's amended articles of incorporation is attached as Exhibit A. Applicant's current organizational chart is attached as Exhibit B.

(3) The name under which the applicant will provide local exchange services and interexchange services if different than in subdivision (1) of this section:

Applicant will provide services under the name Vesta Solutions, Inc.

(4) The location of the applicant's principal office, if any, in this state and the name and address of its current registered agent, if applicable:

Applicant does not have a principal office in South Dakota. The name and address of Applicant's current registered agent is:

(5) A copy of the applicant's certificate of authority to transact business in South Dakota from the secretary of state:

A copy of Applicant's certificate of authority to transact business in South Dakota is attached as Exhibit C.

(6) A description of the applicant's experience providing any telecommunications services in South Dakota or in other jurisdictions, including the types of services provided, and the dates and nature of state or federal authorization to provide the services:

Applicant has not previously provided telecommunications services in South Dakota.

Applicant is currently authorized to provide telecommunications services, including 9-1-1 services, in California, Florida, Maryland, Minnesota, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas, Utah, and Virginia. Applicant has also applied for authority to operate as a 9-1-1 system provider in Illinois. A chart summarizing the types of services authorized and the dates of authorization is attached as Exhibit D.

(7) Names and addresses of applicant's affiliates, subsidiaries, and parent organizations, if any:

Applicant is a direct wholly owned subsidiary of Plant Holdings, Inc. and an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of Motorola Solutions, Inc. ("MSI"), a publicly traded company.

Applicant has two subsidiaries: Vesta Solutions of Virginia, Inc. and Vesta Solutions

Communications Corp. MSI's address is 500 W. Monroe Street, Chicago, Illinois 60661. The address for each of Plant Holdings, Inc., Vesta Solutions of Virginia, Inc., and Vesta Solutions

Communications Corp. is P.O. Box 9007, 42555 Rio Nedo, Temecula, CA 92589-9007.

Through common ownership, Applicant is affiliated with other MSI subsidiaries that are not authorized to provide telecommunications services and are not identified here. A list of MSI's major subsidiaries is provided as Exhibit 21 to MSI's most recent SEC Form 10-K, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit F.

- (8) A list and specific description of the types of services the applicant seeks to offer and how the services will be provided including:
 - (a) Information indicating the classes of customers the applicant intends to serve:

Applicant intends to serve and work collaboratively with government and quasi-government public safety answering points ("PSAPs"), voice over Internet protocol ("VoIP") providers, incumbent local exchange carriers ("ILECs"), wireless providers, competitive local exchange carriers ("CLECs"), and/or other local 9-1-1 authorities. Applicant plans to serve PSAPs that seek to transition from existing legacy networks to next generation 9-1-1 ("NG9-1-1") networks or that seek network components in connection with their 9-1-1 call handling systems.

(b) Information indicating the extent to and time-frame by which applicant will provide service through the use of its own facilities, the purchase of unbundled network elements, or resale:

Applicant intends to provide service as soon as practicable upon grant of this Application.

However, initiation of operations will first require negotiation of interconnection agreements

with other service providers, including successful completion of the installation and/or procurement of any facilities needed for Applicant to provide services in South Dakota. As the time periods required to complete such actions may vary, a firm timeline for the initiation of service has not yet been established.

(c) A description of all facilities that the applicant will utilize to furnish the proposed local exchange services, including any facilities of underlying carriers:

Applicant does not currently own facilities or property in South Dakota but will acquire or construct facilities in the state as necessary to provide its services. To facilitate deployment of services, Applicant intends to enter into interconnection agreements and/or other agreements with other service providers as permitted under the federal Telecommunications Act of 1996, 47 U.S.C. § 251(c).

(d) Information identifying the types of services it seeks authority to provide by reference to the general nature of the service:

Applicant intends to offer 9-1-1 emergency services to government and quasi-government PSAPs. The Vesta portfolio of NG9-1-1 emergency services includes IP-based 9-1-1 call routing, database services, database management, and network services to promote advancement and migration of PSAP networks to the NG9-1-1 architecture. Applicant will not provide long distance voice toll services or local exchange voice dial tone services to residential or business customers.

(9) A service area map or narrative description indicating with particularity the geographic area proposed to be served by the applicant:

Applicant proposes to offer 9-1-1 emergency services throughout the state of South Dakota. Applicant seeks statewide authority.

(10) Information regarding the technical competence of the applicant to provide its proposed local exchange services including:

(a) A description of the education and experience of the applicant's management personnel who will oversee the proposed local exchange services:

Applicant is technically and managerially qualified to provide 9-1-1 services in South Dakota. Since 1968, Vesta has been serving the communications needs of its valued customers, primarily public and private sector organizations that include state and local public safety agencies, corporate entities, and the federal government. In 2016, Frost & Sullivan selected Vesta, then Airbus DS Communications, to receive the 2016 Best Practices Award as the North American NG9-1-1 Contact Handling Solution Company of the Year.² Brendan Read, Senior Industry Analyst of Frost & Sullivan, stated that as "[t]he leading provider of call handling solutions, [Vesta] understands the requirements of jurisdictions large, small, and jointly operated geodiverse agencies. Vesta® NG911 solutions operate on a flexible, open architecture, accommodating regional cooperation, as well as local customization. Adaptable to the unique needs and goals of any jurisdiction or agency, the Vesta suite furnishes the most powerful NG911 solutions on the market." Vesta employs a highly skilled leadership team, including engineers and technical personnel in the communications and public safety industries. Descriptions of the professional backgrounds and experience of Applicant's key management personnel are attached as Exhibit E.

(b) Information regarding policies, personnel, or arrangements made by the applicant which demonstrates the applicant's ability to respond to customer complaints and inquiries promptly and to perform facility and equipment

maintenance necessary to ensure compliance with any commission quality of service requirements:

The Vesta Solutions Service Desk is the central point of contact for customers to report incidents and submit requests. Co-located with the Technical Support Center within the Network Security Operations Center ("NSOC"), the Service Desk provides 24/7/365 availability to promptly assist with customer service needs. The Service Desk can be reached via telephone at (844) 373-6427 or by email at VestaNSOC@motorolasolutions.com. Applicant will perform network and equipment maintenance necessary to ensure that appropriate service levels are maintained.

(11) Information explaining how the applicant will provide customers with access to emergency services such as 911 or enhanced 911, operator services, interexchange services, directory assistance, and telecommunications relay services:

Applicant respectfully requests a waiver of this requirement to the extent necessary because it is not applicable to the services that Applicant will provide. As noted above, Applicant will provide 9-1-1 emergency services to government and quasi-government PSAPs. Applicant will not provide long distance voice toll services or local exchange voice dial tone services to residential or business customers and therefore will not provide customers with access to any of the services referenced above. Waiver of this requirement is in the public interest and is not contrary to universal service, the public safety and welfare, and quality of service. Consistent with S.D. Admin. R. 20:10:32:10, waiver of this requirement is therefore appropriate.

(12) For the most recent 12 month period, financial statements of the applicant consisting of balance sheets, income statements, and cash flow statements. The applicant shall provide audited financial statements, if available:

Applicant is an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of MSI, a publicly traded company. A copy of MSI's most recent SEC Form 10-K containing MSI's consolidated financial statements is attached as Exhibit F.

- (13) Information detailing the following matters associated with interconnection to provide proposed local exchange services:
 - (a) The identity of all local exchange carriers with which the applicant plans to interconnect:

Applicant plans to submit a competitive bid in response to Request for Proposal No. 1569 (the "RFP") issued by the State of South Dakota's Office of Procurement Management regarding Emergency Services IP Network, Statewide Host Remote Call Answering System and Managed Services. Section 3.8 of the RFP requires the vendor to file bona fide requests for connectivity with all phone providers – *i.e.*, all local exchange carriers ("LECs"), CLECs, rural local exchange carriers ("RLECs"), ILECs, all wireless carriers, VoIP carriers, and any other 9-1-1 call source as may be identified by the South Dakota 9-1-1 Board for interconnection to and processing by the NG9-1-1 system as required by law. Applicant plans to interconnect with all South Dakota local exchange carriers pursuant to this RFP requirement where technically feasible and required by law.

(b) The likely timing of initiation of interconnection service and a statement as to when negotiations for interconnection started or when negotiations are likely to start:

Applicant intends to begin interconnection negotiations and initiate interconnection service as soon as possible, though firm timelines have not yet been established.

(c) A copy of any request for interconnection made by the applicant to any local exchange carrier:

Applicant has not yet made requests for interconnection to any local exchange carriers.

(14) A description of how the applicant intends to market its services, its target market, whether the applicant engages in multilevel marketing, and copies of any company brochures that will be used to assist in sale of the services:

As noted above, Applicant intends to offer 9-1-1 emergency services to government and quasi-government PSAPs. Applicant will market services by direct contact with its potential customers and existing customers, who have purchased and who utilize the Applicant's call handling equipment. Applicant does not engage in multilevel marketing. A copy of Applicant's company brochure that will be used to assist in the sale of services is attached as Exhibit G.

(15) If the applicant is seeking authority to provide local exchange service in the service area of a rural telephone company, the date by which the applicant expects to meet the service obligations imposed pursuant to § 20:10:32:15 and applicant's plans for meeting the service obligations:

This Question is not applicable to the services that Applicant will provide. As noted above, Applicant will provide 9-1-1 emergency services to government and quasi-government PSAPs. Applicant will not provide long distance voice toll services or local exchange voice dial tone services to residential or business customers.

(16) A list of the states in which the applicant is registered or certified to provide telecommunications services, whether the applicant has ever been denied registration or certification in any state and the reasons for any such denial, a statement as to whether or not the applicant is in good standing with the appropriate regulatory agency in the states where it is registered or certified, and a detailed explanation of why the applicant is not in good standing in a given state, if applicable:

A list of the states in which Applicant is registered or certified to provide telecommunications services is attached as <u>Exhibit D</u>. Applicant has never been denied registration or certification in any state. Applicant is in good standing with the appropriate regulatory agencies in the states where it is authorized to provide service.

(18) Information concerning how the applicant plans to bill and collect charges from customers who subscribe to its proposed services:

Applicant's government and quasi-government PSAP customers will be billed in accordance with the terms of their individually negotiated contracts.

(19) Information concerning the applicant's policies relating to solicitation of new customers and a description of the efforts the applicant shall use to prevent the unauthorized switching of local service and interexchange customers by the applicant, its employees, or agents:

Applicant intends to solicit customers currently using Vesta call handling products as well as responding to requests for proposals and/or the needs of new customers. As noted above, Applicant intends to offer 9-1-1 emergency services to government and quasi-government PSAPs. Because Applicant will not provide long distance voice toll services or local exchange voice dial tone services to residential or business customers, the portion of this Question pertaining to the unauthorized switching of end-user customers is not applicable.

(20) The number and nature of complaints filed against the applicant with any state or federal commission regarding the unauthorized switching of a customer's telecommunications provider and the act of charging customers for services that have not been ordered:

Applicant has not been the subject of any complaints filed with any state or federal commission regarding the unauthorized switching of a customer's telecommunications provider or the act of charging customers for services that have not been ordered.

(21) Information concerning how the applicant will make available to any person information concerning the applicant's current rates, terms, and conditions for all of its telecommunications services:

As noted above, Applicant will not provide long distance voice toll services or local exchange voice dial tone services to residential or business customers. The rates, terms, and conditions for Applicant's 9-1-1 emergency services will be set forth in individually negotiated contracts with Applicant's government and quasi-government PSAP customers.

(22) Information concerning how the applicant will notify a customer of any materially adverse change to any rate, term, or condition of any telecommunications service being provided to the customer. The notification must be made at least thirty days in advance of the change:

Applicant will notify its government and quasi-government PSAP customers of any materially adverse changes to the rates, terms, and conditions of Applicant's 9-1-1 emergency services pursuant to the terms of their individually negotiated contracts.

(23) A written request for waiver of those rules believed to be inapplicable:

Because Applicant will not provide long distance voice toll services or local exchange voice dial tone services to residential or business customers, Applicant respectfully requests a waiver of S.D. Admin. R. 20:10:32:10, which requires telecommunications companies providing local exchange services to make the following services available their customers: (1) access to the public switched network; (2) access to emergency services such as 911 or enhanced 911; (3) access to a local directory and directory assistance; (4) access to operator services; (5) telecommunications relay service capability or access necessary to comply with state and federal regulations; (6) nonpublished service upon written or verbal request of the customer; and (7) access to interexchange services.

(24) Federal tax identification number and South Dakota sales tax number:

Applicant's federal tax identification number is 95-2580952. Applicant's South Dakota sales tax number will be obtained upon commencing services in South Dakota.

(25) Other information requested by the commission needed to demonstrate that the applicant has sufficient technical, financial, and managerial capabilities to provide

the local exchange services it intends to offer consistent with the requirements of this chapter and other applicable rules and laws:

Granting this Application will serve the public interest. Applicant seeks a certificate of authority to provide 9-1-1 emergency services to government and quasi-government PSAPs throughout South Dakota, which will accelerate the development and deployment of NG9-1-1 services and promote more robust public safety offerings that will benefit and protect South Dakota residents. Accordingly, Applicant respectfully requests that the Commission grant this Application expeditiously.
