SECTION 63.71 APPLICATION

CenturyLink¹ hereby applies for authorization pursuant to Section 63.71 of the Federal Communications Commission's (Commission) rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, and Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 214, to grandfather its Converged Voice Services currently offered in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. CenturyLink ultimately plans to discontinue these services but is not seeking authority to do so at this time.

CenturyLink provides the following information pursuant to Section 63.71 of the Commission's Rules:

2. Date of Planned Service Discontinuance

As of February 15, 2022, or as soon thereafter as the necessary regulatory approvals can be obtained, CenturyLink will no longer offer Converged Voice Services to new customers.

Existing customers of these services will be grandfathered as follows:

- The Converged Services bundles will no longer be available to new customers.
- The SIA firewall service currently included in the Voice + VPN + Secure Internet Access bundle will no longer be available as part of that bundle.
- Customers with a contract may retain their bundle on a month-to-month basis once that contract expires, except for the SIA firewall service.
- Existing contracts may be renewed for a 12-month period.
- Moves, Adds and Changes will be allowed as part of an active contact.

3. Points of Geographic Areas of Service Affected

CenturyLink seeks authority to grandfather the provision of Converged Voice Services currently offered in all 50 states and the District of Columbia.

4. Description of Service Affected

Converged Voice Services are flexible bandwidth bundled services consisting of local exchange service with selected features, a Long Distance and/or Toll Free usage allowance, and the option of adding Internet Access and/or Virtual Private Network (VPN) service. All Converged Voice Services include a fully managed integrated access device placed at the customer premises. Services can be provided via a TDM interface (T1 or DS3) or via an Ethernet interface. The Converged Voice Services bundles are described as follows:

The Voice + Internet bundle: The Customer designates the number of voice channels to be configured as described above. The remaining available bandwidth, including excess bandwidth available when all voice services are not in use, will be dynamically allocated for Internet access service.

The Voice + VPN bundle: The Customer designates the number of voice channels to be configured as described above. The remaining available bandwidth, including excess bandwidth available when all voice services are not in use, will be dynamically allocated for VPN access service.

Voice + VPN + Secure Internet Access: The Customer designates the number of voice channels to be configured as described above. The remaining available bandwidth, including excess bandwidth available when all voice services are not in use, will be dynamically allocated for VPN access service and Secure Internet Access (SIA) firewall service.

The public convenience and necessity will not be adversely affected by the grandfathering of the service bundles described herein. Current customers of those service bundles will not be losing those services. No other products or services are impacted by this application.

5. Brief Description of the Dates and Methods of Notice to All Affected Customers

CenturyLink notified customers of the plan to grandfather Converged Voice Services in a letter sent via U.S. Mail on December 17, 2021. Those customers were notified that the proposed grandfathering would take effect on February 15, 2022, or as soon after that date as authorized by the relevant regulatory commissions. A copy of the customer notification is appended hereto. (*See Attachment A.*)

6. Whether the Carrier is Considered Dominant or Non-dominant with Respect to the Service to be Grandfathered

CenturyLink is considered non-dominant with respect to the services to be grandfathered.

7. Other Information

In accordance with Section 63.71(a) of the Commission's Rules, a copy of this application is being mailed concurrently with its filing to the entities listed on the attached certificate of service.
