Those actions never resulted in raising the necessary working capital. So when the license was suspended there were those two. One of them is a current board member, and the other is a former board member who are still holding voluntary credit sales, and those are the two creditors.

COMMISSIONER FIEGEN: So the bond, there is no claims on the bond because those were volunteer credit sales?

MR. MEHLHAFF: There is a load of grain that could possibly be a bond claim, depending on the results of the liquidation actions. So there is a possibility of a single bond claim, which would be for less than \$5,000.
