25	The question today is what is the Commission's

decision. And I should note at the outset that I thank the parties for their input on this. It certainly was a challenging case and certainly one involving law. We've seen in the past on the wireline side that certainly ETC designation has helped our providers in South Dakota be able to bring some state-of-the-art services to rural areas especially but to parts of the state that might not otherwise have them, and I think we can all be very happy with the state of telecommunications on the wireline side.

On the wireless side we all, I think, share the common goal of wanting to see rural areas get better coverage, get enhanced services, and to see that happen sooner rather than later. And that, frankly, is going to involve some investment, and that potential investment can have a very positive impact for public safety, for economic development, and for consumers' choice.

And while those policy considerations I think probably are in the back of everyone's mind, the question really becomes whether or not the legal requirements for ETC status have been met. And I think in this case that they have been met and I'm going to go through a rather lengthy Motion but I

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do want to note that in my belief and putting forth this Motion that ETC designation is appropriate. We certainly are not doing this without strings and we certainly expect this to be a process that will have follow-up and that will demonstrate that the money is being spent appropriately and we certainly want to see dollars invested into new infrastructure as much as possible.

And we are, you know, encouraged by indications that 17 new towers are on the way for this year and we hope that we can continue to see similar build-out along those lines but ultimately it does come down to a legal issue and a legal test.

With that in mind, I am going to make the following Motion: I move that the Commission find that Western Wireless has met the requirements to be designated as an ETC in the requested ETC service areas. I further move that the designation of Western Wireless as an additional ETC in the requested service areas is in the public interest subject to the following conditions:

One, Western Wireless shall comply with the conditions set forth in Findings of Fact 20 through 24 of the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law in

order in Docket No. TC98-146. Western Wireless may amend its compliance filing in Docket TC98-146 to add the newly designated areas and to use the same service agreements and procedures in the requested service areas as previously filed with the Commission. For any requirement that cannot be fulfilled by amending the previous compliance filing, Western Wireless may submit the document in this proceeding. Western Wireless will not have to make a separate compliance filing in order to be designated as an ETC in this Docket.

Two, Western Wireless shall continue to build out facilities and extend service to meet the statutory obligations of offering service "throughout the service area for which the designation is received."

Three, in conjunction with but separate from and in addition to the annual certification filings under 47 CFR 54.313 and 54.314 Western Wireless shall submit records and documentation on an annual basis detailing its progress towards meeting the statutory objective of offering service throughout the service area for which the designation is received. At a minimum such information shall detail the capital expenditure made by Petitioner

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within each RLEC's service area during the preceding annual period and shall include its proposed capital budget for each RLEC's service area for the ensuing year.

Four, Western Wireless shall annually submit a proposed plan for the upcoming calendar year which sets forth Western Wireless's proposed facility expansion and service enhancement to the existing facilities. The plan shall be submitted no later than January 1 of each year. Following the filing due January 1, 2005 Western Wireless's subsequent annual filing shall also submit a report stating whether the proposed plan was implemented, any deviations from the previous year's proposed plan and the reason for any deviations. Following this annual filing --

CHAIRMAN SAHR: Following this annual filing, Western Wireless shall meet with Commission staff to discuss the proposed plans and any deviation from a previous year's proposed plans.

Five, Western Wireless shall construct the 17 additional cell sites during 2004 as it

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committed to in its proceeding. If it is unable to construct all 17 cell sites during 2004, Western Wireless shall submit a report detailing the reasons why it is unable to do so and shall thereafter submit monthly reports detailing its progress towards meeting this goal.

Six, Western Wireless shall continue to abide by the terms of the Cellular Telecommunications Industry Associates Consumer Code For Wireless Services as it is amended from time to time.

Seven, by January 1 of each year, Western Wireless shall provide an annual report detailing the consumer Complaints that it has received during the previous one-year period. This report shall include categories for the Complaints.

Eight, by January 1 of each year Western Wireless shall provide a report itemizing requests for service from potential customers within each RLEC's service area that went unfulfilled during the previous year, including the steps Western Wireless took to provide service and the reason why such requests went unfulfilled. And I'll add on to that "if so," if so unfulfilled.

Following the submission of this report Western Wireless shall meet with Commission staff

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to discuss the report.

And that concludes my Motion.

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COMMISSIONER BURG: I'll second the Motion. To me this is maybe one of the most important decisions we've made this year. I think it's important that we get whatever funds are available to help get the build-out in South Dakota necessary but at the same time we treat the providers that we have here fairly.

I have been very, very concerned that the money that -- in other words, ETC status was implemented so that money could be available to get wireless service into areas that would not be affordable otherwise, and I think we need to take advantage of that. I've been extremely concerned, though, that those moneys be spent in the areas that made them eligible to receive the moneys.

I am satisfied that the way this is written and that the order that we will submit will give us that opportunity to receive those dollars and to make sure those dollars go for the purpose that they were designated to. So that's the reason that I am seconding the Motion.

VICE CHAIR HANSON: This is Commissioner Hanson. I concur with the Motion.

Western Wireless went through a -- I have to say I really appreciate the passion and the completeness that all of the parties went to and the presentations that we received.

Western Wireless has fulfilled their requirements to show that they are entitled to the ETC status. As previous Commissioners have stated and I might state it a little bit differently, in order to provide the services that the rural areas truly deserve to have, in order to have the economic prosperity, the quality of life and certainly from a health and safety standpoint I believe it's important to provide the opportunity for the funding which comes through the ETC status for Western Wireless so I concur on the Motion.

COMMISSIONER BURG: Maybe I would like to add one other thing. I also think we have the ability through the annual certification to make what adjustments are necessary to make sure that they do comply. I was completely prepared to deny this if I did not feel that the dollars that were going to be received from the Universal Service Fund were not going to be spent in the areas that made them eligible, and if it doesn't prove to be, I imagine we can make those
