CHAIRMAN HANSON: EL04-032, In the

And there's no question before the Commission today, no hearing. The item up is the Commission's Decision.

I will make a Motion at this time that we approve Dakota Turkey Growers' Petition with DTG's own facilities. This approval would include at a minimum the plant itself, the office building, and the future expansions of either of these. These facilities will be built on previously undeveloped land, and I think they clearly fall within what the statute means by a new customer at a new location which develops after March 21, 1975. This approval would not extend at this time to the truck stop.

With respect to the six factors set forth in SDCL 49-34A-56, I think the primary inquiry that the statute directs us to make once we're satisfied that the initial threshold findings have been met is into the adequacy of the service that the chosen utility can provide and the preference of the

customer.

VICE CHAIRMAN SAHR: And,

Mr. Chairman, I will second that Motion and maybe provide just a little more rationale on the location. And certainly our Order will certainly get into that as well in more detail. But I think the Commission felt strongly that the plant as you articulated was a new customer at a new location and that the statutory requirements had been met.

In the case of the truck stop, however, right now it appears to be something that is speculative in nature. We don't know if that is actually going to go forward. And if you look at the statute, it seems to be driven a lot by the customer and customer requirements, size of the customer.

You also have the question about whether or not this would be a new location. And if you look at, you know, the Decker farmhouse being out there, I think we have to get into a more in-depth factual inquiry to determine whether or not this was a new location. But I do feel strongly that the plant itself is a new location and that this is the correct decision for that parcel.

COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: I would concur and just add that I agree with the rationale

provided by both Commissioners Hanson and Sahr. To me this really is a customer choice statute, once you meet the statutory requirements. I think that's been done in this case. We all realize this is a very important project for South Dakota.

I would also add this I think was an important case for the Commission. It was made difficult by the fact that both Dakota Energy and Northwestern are excellent service providers. They do a good job of providing safe, reliable, and affordable energy to their customers.

It's also, I think, made more difficult by the fact that the statute can be reasonably interpreted in a number of different ways, and I thought both sides had very compelling legal arguments. I certainly spent a lot more time debating in my mind what I thought a new location is than I ever thought I would.

With that, I would concur.

CHAIRMAN HANSON: Thank you, gentlemen. Those are very good points. We understand how important this is for the City of Huron for economic development purposes.
