 trying to quantify what happens if you grant this. The rates are suspended for a minimum of 120 days, is it, and then maybe 160, and if the docket is not completed in that time, then I believe the statute provides the rates can go into effect.

But we're talking about a lot of .. a lot of dollars to the local exchange carriers. And those losses could be even greater if the minutes of use continue to decline and as you extend it out farther and farther and farther away from that historical test year, that's what happens.

I would also point out that the IXCs are unharmed because the statute does allow for you, the Commission, to order a refund and also to order interest. And I recognize what Mr. Gerdes says with regard to a refund plan and a lot of that depends on the amount of the refund. I mean, when we're talking about the refund, for example, for the TC03-108 docket, which was actually for two months that that rate was in effect, we're talking a total of less than $\$ 25,000$.

If you handled .. I mean, how you approve refunding that is certainly up to the Commission, but to issue a bunch of checks to a bunch of carriers in less than a dollar amount, certainly
seems to be very confusing as opposed to what we have done in other instances and that would be to reduce the revenue requirement of the next filing.

So there's a lot of discretion and a lot of latitude that the Commission has. But I think that the IXCs can be unharmed in the process. So for these reasons, because of the magnitude of the effect on the local exchange carriers and the fact that the IXCs can by statute be held harmless, we would urge you to resist the Motion to suspend the rates.
