Whereas, The South Dakota Public Utilities Commission and South Dakota One Call Board encourage and promote calling 811 before digging to preserve personal safety and the integrity of underground utilities; and,

Whereas, Calling 811 sets into motion a series of steps whereby underground utilities are visually marked to direct excavators to dig safely; and,

Whereas, Calling 811 minimizes the damages and dangers of hitting an underground utility line. The consequences of jeopardizing or damaging a utility line includes service interruption, damage to the environment, and injury or even death; and,

Whereas, Through communication of safe digging practices, excavators and homeowners can save time and money and remain safe and connected by making a simple call to 811 prior to any digging project; and,

Whereas, Requests for underground facility locates can be made by calling 811, or entering the request electronically via the www.SDOneCall.com website or mobile app; and,

Whereas, Locate requests are accepted by South Dakota One Call 24 hours a day, seven days a week; and,

Whereas, In 2014, the South Dakota One Call Center fielded nearly 134,000 locate requests resulting in more than 802,000 tickets sent to companies to mark their underground facilities at excavation sites; and,

Whereas, Excavation activity in South Dakota often increases in the spring months among homeowners, contactors, and professional excavators; and,

Whereas, Safe digging is crucial for us all. To Know What's Below; Call 811 Before You Dig:
