On October 24, 1997, the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received a Complaint from Avery and Dixie Thompson (Complainant) against U S WEST Communications, Inc. (U S WEST) alleging delays in installation of phone service and inadequacies in providing service.

Pursuant to ARSD 20:10:01:08.01 and 20:10:01:09, if a complaint cannot be settled without formal action, the Commission shall determine if the complaint shows probable cause of an unlawful or unreasonable act, rate, practice or omission to go forward with the complaint.

On October 28, 1997, at its duly noticed ad hoc meeting, the Commission reviewed the complaint. The Commission voted unanimously to find probable cause.

TAKE NOTICE that a hearing in this matter will be held on January 14, 1998, at 1:00 o'clock P.M. in the Brule County Courthouse, Jury Room, 300 S. Courtland, Chamberlain, SD.

The Commission has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to SDCL Chapters 1-26, 49-13, including 49-13-1 through 49-13-27, inclusive, and 49-31, including 49-31-3, 49-31-7, 49-31-7.1, 49-31-7.2, 49-31-10, 49-31-11, 49-31-38, 49-31-38.1, 49-31-38.2, 49-31-38.3 and ARSD 20:10:01:07.01 through 20:10:01:15.01, inclusive. The Commission may rely upon any or all of these or other laws of this state in making its determination.

The issue at the hearing is whether U S WEST committed an unlawful or unreasonable act, rate, practice or omission.

All persons so testifying will be subject to cross-examination by the parties. The order of the proceeding will be in the following sequence: (1) Complainant; (2) U S WEST; and (3) Staff.

The hearing is an adversary proceeding conducted pursuant to SDCL Chapter 1-26. All parties have the right to attend and represent themselves or be represented by an attorney. However, such rights and other due process rights shall be forfeited if not exercised at the hearing. If you or your representative fail to appear at the time and place set for the hearing, the Final Decision will be based solely on testimony and evidence provided, if any, during the hearing or a Final Decision may be issued by default pursuant to SDCL 1-26-20.

The Commission, after examining the evidence and hearing testimony presented by the parties, shall make Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and a Final Decision. As a result of the hearing, the Commission may determine whether U S WEST committed an

10. The tenth part of the document is a letter from the editor to the author, dated 11/25/1964. The editor expresses interest in the author's work and suggests that the author submit a paper for consideration.

11. The eleventh part of the document is a letter from the author to the editor, dated 12/1/1964. The author responds to the editor's letter and expresses interest in the possibility of publishing a paper on the topic.

12. The twelfth part of the document is a letter from the editor to the author, dated 12/5/1964. The editor expresses interest in the author's work and suggests that the author submit a paper for consideration.

13. The thirteenth part of the document is a letter from the author to the editor, dated 12/10/1964. The author responds to the editor's letter and expresses interest in the possibility of publishing a paper on the topic.

14. The fourteenth part of the document is a letter from the editor to the author, dated 12/15/1964. The editor expresses interest in the author's work and suggests that the author submit a paper for consideration.

unlawful or unreasonable act, rate, practice, or omission and may determine damages, fines or other remedies for service quality as provided by law. The Final Decision may be appealed by the parties to the Circuit Court and the South Dakota Supreme Court as provided by law. It is therefore

ORDERED that a hearing shall be held on the complaint of Avery and DixieThompson as specified above.
