On April 8, 2008, South Dakota Network, LLC (SDN) filed an application for waiver of the requirement to submit "cost data in support of its switched access service tariff no less than once every three years" as required by Commission rule ARSD 20:10:27:07. ARSD 20:10:27:02 provides that the Commission may, for good cause shown, either by its own motion or by application from a carrier's carrier, temporarily waive or suspend any rule in chapters 20:10:27 to 20:10:29, inclusive. SDN requests the waiver of the cost study requirement because of the costs and resources involved in producing a study, and indicated that a preliminary analysis indicates that a cost study would support higher rates.

On April 10, 2008, the Commission electronically transmitted notice of the filing and the intervention deadline of April 25, 2008, to interested individuals and entities. No petitions to intervene or comments were filed.

The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to SDCL 1-26-17.1, 49-1A-9, 49-31-12.6, 49-31-18, 49-31-19, and ARSD 20:10:01:15.02, 20:10:01:15.05, 20:10:27:07 and 20:10:27:08.

On May 6, 2008, at its regularly scheduled meeting, the Commission found good cause to grant the requested waiver. It is therefore

ORDERED, that the requested waiver is hereby granted.
