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CHAIRMAN NELSON: I will call the ad hoc meeting of the Public Utilities Commission to order. We are obviously operating in two different locations, the University Center in Sioux Falls and Room 414 in Pierre.

I am present in Sioux Falls along with Commissioners Hanson and Fiegen. Acting Commissioner Sattgast is in the meeting room in Pierre.

Just a couple of housekeeping notes. The live webcast of this meeting for some reason is not working.

And so it's being recorded in three different manners, but the live webcast is not working. And so we are going to proceed with the meeting. They are furiously working to try to get the live webcast working.

But if they don't, we will take the recording of this meeting and place it on our website at the conclusion of this meeting so the public will have full access to everything that is said and done here.

With that, we've got two different dockets to deal with today. We're going to deal with HP14-002, In the Matter of the Application of Dakota Access, LLC for an Energy Facility Permit to Construct the Dakota Access Pipeline.

We've got a number of different motions.

Obviously, Commissioner Fiegen is not going to be participating in this portion of the meeting. And we are

1 going to proceed in this order on the motion. The first 2 motion that I think we're going to deal with is from 3 South Dakota Association of Rural Water Systems' Motion 4 to Substitute Witness. 5 Is their attorney present there in Pierre? 6 MS. WIEST: Yes. 7 COMMISSIONER HANSON: Mr. Chairman. 8 CHAIRMAN NELSON: Yes. Just hang on. Mr. Hanson. 10 COMMISSIONER HANSON: Before you proceed with 11 that, I need to make a statement. 12 Five days ago I learned that my daughter's 13 husband's grandmother, Doris Haber, is a property owner 14 who is affected by the proposed Dakota Access Pipeline. 15 She is negotiating an easement at the present time with 16 Dakota Access. She is not an Intervenor. However, because this is not a close connection 17 18 to me, I do not believe this presents a conflict of 19 interest to me. However, I wanted to make it certain 20 that this is disclosed on the record. 21 So I will not be recusing myself, but I do want 22 all of the parties to be aware of that. 2.3 CHAIRMAN NELSON: Very appropriate. And thank you for sharing that with us. 24

COMMISSIONER FIEGEN: And I'm going to leave.

1 | Commissioner Sattgast, you're in control.

MS. NORTHRUP: This is Margo Northrup on behalf of the South Dakota Association of Rural Water Systems.

The statewide association is an association that is made up of nonprofit rural water systems.

(Discussion off the record)

MS. NORTHRUP: As I was saying, my name is
Margo Northrup. I'm the attorney for the South Dakota
Association of Rural Water Systems, which is the
statewide association made up of nonprofit rural water
systems throughout the State of South Dakota. We have
seven member systems that are going to be impacted by the
Dakota Access Pipeline.

I have filed prefiled testimony of Steve Harper who is the general manager in one of -- WEB Water, which is one of the member companies that was impacted by the Dakota Access project.

WEB Water has reached an agreement with Dakota Access Pipeline, and I learned probably two weeks ago that Mr. Harper was no longer employed with WEB Water. He left rather suddenly. And so I filed this motion to substitute a witness, Dan Zolkowsky, who is a construction engineer from Lewis & Clark.

1 As a practical matter, Lewis & Clark is the only 2 system who still has outstanding concerns with Dakota 3 Access Pipeline that we're still working through, but I 4 would like to substitute Dan for Steve Harper. 5 I did provide prefiled testimony, which is very 6 similar to what was submitted on behalf of Steve Harper. Our primary issue is, you know, the safety of the 7 8 crossings. With that, I can stand by for any questions. 10 CHAIRMAN NELSON: Thank you. I'm going to go to 11 the Applicant. MR. KOENECKE: Good morning, Commissioner. 12 13 have no objection to Ms. Northrup's request this morning. 14 We just found out about the issues that Lewis & Clark has 15 raised within about the last week, and, as she said, we 16 are diligently working on those. 17 So, as she said, they have arisen late in the 18 process, and we have spent time as late as last night and 19 early as prior to this this morning working on this issue 20 and we certainly have no objection to her request. 21 Thank you. 22 CHAIRMAN NELSON: Thank you. 2.3 Intervenors, any of the Intervenors? 2.4 Ms. Real Bird?

CHAIRMAN NELSON: I'm not sure who's on the 19 20 phone, but we're hearing somebody speaking there. 21 We have a motion on the floor. 22 Discussion on the motion. 2.3 Let me just echo Commissioner Hanson's comments. 24 This is certainly not preferable for the Commission. 25 frankly, enjoy having folks appear in person. I think it

1 gives us a better feel for where they're coming from and 2 a better opportunity to ask our questions. 3 But by the same case, I think Mr. Boomsma's made 4 a compelling case in the case of these specific witnesses that this may in some of their cases be the only way 6 they'll be able to testify, and we certainly do want to 7 hear from them so I will support the motion. Additional discussion? 9 Hearing none, all those in favor will vote aye; 10 those opposed, nay. 11 Commissioner Sattgast. 12 COMMISSIONER SATTGAST: Aye. 13 CHAIRMAN NELSON: Commissioner Hanson. 14 COMMISSIONER HANSON: Aye. 15 CHAIRMAN NELSON: Nelson votes aye. 16 carries. 17 We have a series of motions for time certain, if 18 I can -- and I'm going to try to sort all of these out. 19 It looks like an awful lot of people want to testify on 20 October 6. But we'll take these one at a time and see 21 where we end up. 22 I'm going to begin with Sioux Falls's motion. 2.3 Ms. Best is here in the room with us, and I'm going to 24 put you on camera. 25 Go ahead, Diane.

MS. BEST: Thank you. Diane Best, representing the City of Sioux Falls.

The Dakota Access Pipeline as presently proposed would run parallel to the west boundary of the Sioux Falls Landfill. We have intervened and expect the landfill manager to testify about proposed conditions that Sioux Falls would ask for to protect various landfill features and structures.

It will be short testimony, and, in fact, we're talking to Dakota Access Pipeline to determine whether they are willing to stipulate to any of those particular conditions.

If we do not reach a stipulation, of course, we will need the landfill manager to travel to Pierre and testify, which we have no objection to. And we certainly understand that you have a long Procedural Schedule and that it's not always easy to decide exactly when people can testify in advance and we can't precisely schedule all witnesses.

Nonetheless, we do have a staffing issue at the landfill at the present time due to recent staffing changes. We do not have an assistant landfill manager. So our landfill manager, Dustin Hanson, really needs to be at the landfill to the extent possible, rather than being on deck for a week in Pierre. Pierre is a lovely

1 city, but he does need to be back at the landfill. 2 So I filed a motion basically asking for a range 3 of time, somewhere the afternoon of the 6th or morning of 4 the 7th just to lodge some kind of time frame so rather than having him be there a whole week. And so that's the 6 consideration I'm asking for at this time. 7 CHAIRMAN NELSON: So I'm understanding he would 8 prefer to be at the landfill than in Pierre. MS. BEST: Well, that's what he's telling me. Ι 10 think that's hard to believe. But yeah. 11 CHAIRMAN NELSON: I'm with you. 12 Okay. We'll go to Dakota Access. 13 MR. KOENECKE: No objection, Commissioners. 14 CHAIRMAN NELSON: Thank you. Ms. Real Bird. 15 MS. REAL BIRD: The Tribe has no objection. 16 CHAIRMAN NELSON: Ms. Edwards. 17 MS. EDWARDS: Staff has no objection. 18 CHAIRMAN NELSON: Ouestions from Commissioners. 19 If not, motions. 20 And I will move in HP14-002 that we set a time 21 certain of the morning of October 7 for the witness from 22 Sioux Falls. 2.3 Discussion on the motion. 24 I chose that particular time as opposed to the 25 6th since I think it will be just a little later in the

1 In addition, we ask the Commission for an order allowing two of our witnesses to go on October 6. 2 3 Ms. Spotted Eagle happens to have some obligations around this time, and October 6 is the date that will work best 4 for her schedule. 6 Mr. Saunsoci is our chief of police, and due to 7 other officers' training schedules he's going to have to 8 pick up some more patrol shifts. And so he would like to narrow down October 6 as well. 10 If October 6 gets too crowded, there's an 11 outside chance he could be there on the 1st or 2nd. he would prefer October 6, looking ahead at the patrol 12 13 schedule for that law enforcement unit. 14 And that's our request. Thank you. 15 CHAIRMAN NELSON: What about Mr. Cooke? 16 MS. REAL BIRD: He is going to be available all 17 days of the hearing with the exception of September 30. 18 CHAIRMAN NELSON: Okay. So we're just dealing 19 with the two then; correct? 20 MS. REAL BIRD: Correct. 21 CHAIRMAN NELSON: And I think there was some 22 confusion. October 6 is a Tuesday, I believe. And 2.3 that's the day that you want; correct? 2.4 MS. REAL BIRD: Yes. My understanding is we're 25 not having the hearing on October 5, Monday. And the 6th

I'm talking about obviously 17 the telephonic ones. And I estimate there will be eight 18 of them. And then, yes, in addition to that would be my live witnesses. 19 20 CHAIRMAN NELSON: Okay.
