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> Please explain if this map is a final map with regards to placement of the industrial wind turbines for the proposed Prevailing Wind Industrial Wind Park.

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> My question is whether or not an industrial wind turbine that is or is not-referenced on this map could be placed closer to my home and property or any other owner's home and/or property, once and if the PUC chooses not to deny the permit?

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> My concern is the location of the industrial wind turbines in the proximity of occupied residences. Clear evidence and simple common sense shows that reduced enjoyment of one's property, negative health effects for some, diminished property value as well as the chance a property can not be sold increases the closer the proximity of industrial wind tower to the property.

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> These are some of the reasons I ask the PUC to deny the permit.
