Under the description it states the location as 29,400 feet downstream of **Valve MP 4324**. I cannot find this milepost in ND, SD or NE. I think it is possible it should be MP 432.4 which would be a valve near Yankton, SD. If possible, could you please look into this and let me know the correct location for the pipeline worst case discharge in response zone 3?
