This temporary permit to use public waters for construction purposes is issued to <u>Dakota Access LLC</u>, <u>1300 Main St.</u>, <u>Houston TX 77002</u> authorizing withdrawal of <u>1,000,000</u> gallons of water at a maximum rate of <u>1,500</u> gallons per minute from <u>ground water (private irrigation well)</u> located <u>in the NW ¹/₄ Section 20, T112N, R59W, Beadle County.</u> The project involves construction of the Dakota Access Pipeline including use of water for horizontal directional drill construction and testing and mainline testing of the pipe prior to operation.

Coverage must be obtained under the General Permit for Temporary Discharges prior to discharge of any water. This permit is issued through the Surface Water Quality Program within this Department.

This temporary permit becomes effective May 1, 2016 and expires on December 31, 2016.

This permit does not provide necessary right-of-way. Such arrangements should be made with the proper land owner.

Issuance of this temporary permit deals with the withdrawal of water only. It does not address other concerns or permitting issues from other State or Federal entities.

Pearl Creek is within the area inhabited by Topeka Shiners. Issuance of this temporary permit deals with the withdrawal of water only. It does not address other concerns or permitting issues, such as the Topeka Shiner, from other State or Federal entities.

Low flows as needed for downstream domestic use, including livestock water and prior water rights must be bypassed.

If current conditions continue, it is likely that water availability will be a problem. An alternate source of water will need to be secured in the event flows in the creek diminish. If flows decrease to a level that impact domestic use and prior water rights, this temporary water permit will be rescinded.

Coverage must be obtained under the General Permit for Temporary Discharges prior to discharge of any water. This permit is issued through the Surface Water Quality Program within this Department.

This temporary permit to use public waters for construction purposes is issued to <u>Dakota Access LLC</u>, 1300 Main St., Houston TX 77002 authorizing withdrawal of 800,000 gallons of water at a maximum rate of 1,500 gallons per minute from the East Fork Vermillion River located in the <u>SW 1/4 Section 16, T106N, R54W, Lake County</u>. The project involves construction of the Dakota Access Pipeline including use of water for horizontal directional drill construction and testing and mainline testing of the pipe prior to operation.

The East Fork of the Vermillion River is potentially within an area inhabited by Topeka Shiners. Issuance of this temporary permit deals with the withdrawal of water only. It does not address other concerns or permitting issues, such as the Topeka Shiner, from other State or Federal entities.

Low flows as needed for downstream domestic use, including livestock water and prior water rights must be bypassed.

If current conditions continue, it is likely that water availability will be a problem. An alternate source of water will need to be secured in the event flows in the river diminish. If flows decrease to a level that impact domestic use and prior water rights, this temporary water permit will be rescinded.
