These CO2 pipelines are highly pressurized (2,100 PSI) and are plotted next to homes in rural Lincoln and Minnehaha counties, against the will of home and landowners. A CO2 pipeline rupture could be catastrophic and deadly.

Unproven Carbon Pipelines Pose a Dangerous Threat

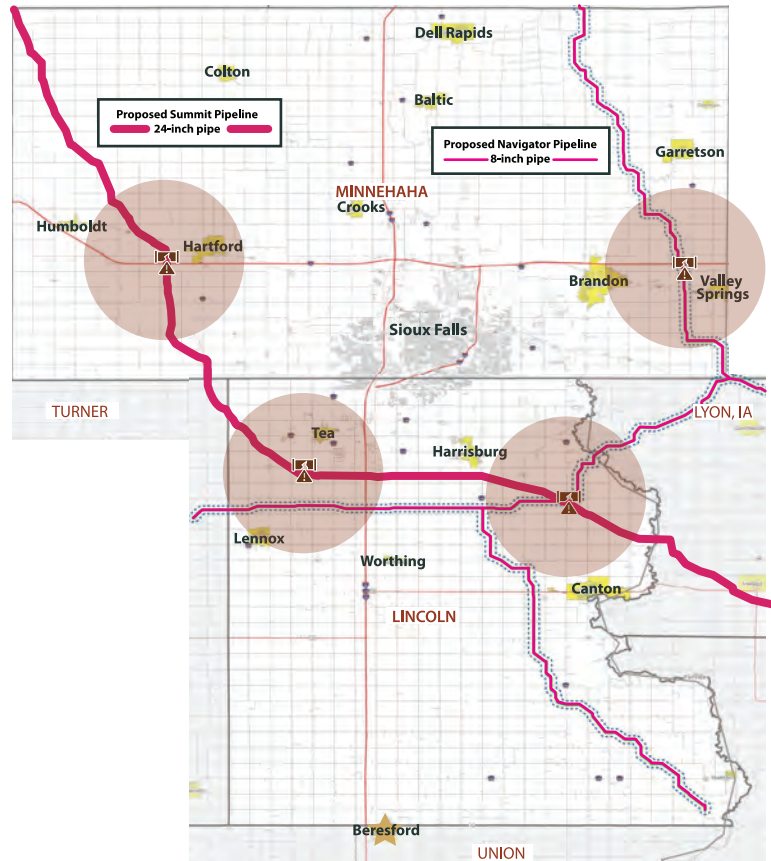
Here's what they aren't telling you.
