To the SD PUC,

We are sending this email to express our opposition to the pipeline project proposed by Summit Carbon Solutions (SCS). Our opposition is manyfold, starting with the tactics that this company is using trying to gain access to our land and flat out lying to our face about neighbors signing easements when they really haven't signed anything. Their comments in the news are very misleading to say the least. This is not a company we want to place our trust in for the future that this pipeline would be well maintained and that they will take care of problems when they arise, and they will arise at some point. When there is a problem, there is a real question as to who is going to be held liable.

We are not experts on pipelines or the legal process to get a permit or an easement for the pipeline. We do know that a pipeline running 4 feet in the ground at 120 degrees is not going to raise a crop most years in this area, and it will interfere with spring access to a field that this pipeline crosses.
