First of all, we want to thank you for taking the time to hold the public input meetings for concerned landowners and citizens of South Dakota regarding the Summit Carbon Solutions proposed pipeline.

Since then, we have talked with many landowners in Minnehaha County. Because SCS has changed the route several times, there is still **SO MUCH CONFUSION** on where the actual route is proposed to be in our county. We also believe that there are many landowners unaware that this pipeline could be crossing their land and/or going close to their homes. We know of landowners on the east side of Sioux Falls that think they are still the alternate route for SCS. We have talked with landowners on the west side that thought they were on the route and now think the route has been moved a couple miles away from them. After being a landowner where the Dakota Access pipeline crossed, we know that it takes time to become informed, process this information and if desired, become an intervenor.

Please verify the actual route is what was posted on the PUC website dated 3/11/22? Can the PUC staff call the landowners in Minnehaha County to let them know for sure that the pipeline is proposed to cross their land? Will you hold additional public input meetings? Since the May Adam firm were the attorneys for Dakota Access, they are well informed of the process of landowners legal right to a 30 day notice. Was this lack of landowner notice really a mistake? SCS is trying to get their application approved before many SD landowners have the opportunity to understand the entire process. How is this fair to these landowners/citizens with the upcoming deadline of April 8th so quickly approaching?

**We ask that you consider the rights, safety and risk to SD citizens in addition to the liability placed on landowners.**
