This is in response to the February 11, 2022, letter sent to multiple South Dakota land owners regarding Summit Carbon Solutions.

On July 24, 2021, Gail Marx Eberlein and Judy Marx (landowners) received an introductory letter from Summit Carbon Solutions announcing “a pipeline project to take capture carbon dioxide being emitted by ethanol and biorefiners in South Dakota and elsewhere and permanently sequestering it underground.” Unfortunately, our farm land is included in that proposal.

On August 17, 2021, at our request, our attorney Todd Wilkinson replied to Summit Carbon Solutions’ initial letter stating, “My clients have a number of questions and concerns regarding the project and do not want to allow access to their property.” It was our hope that quick negative responses would elicit a rerouting of the pipeline.

Unfortunately, the February 11, 2022, letter notifying landowners of an application for a permit to construct the pipeline with the Public Utilities Commission told us otherwise. As the landowners, Gail Marx Eberlein and Judy Marx continue to fervently oppose any part of the project on the Marx farmland, as it has come to be known for decades. Dad (Harvey Marx) worked tirelessly to acquire the land, always providing TLC to every acre, as well as employment and livelihoods for farm workers and a productive living to our long-term renters. He would strongly oppose this intrusion, destruction and possible soil damage that would be a part of it. This land is the legacy that he developed and

proudly left in his family's care. As those caretakers, we continue to object to any part of the pipeline placement on our property and are insistent that it be rerouted.
