APPLICANT'S MOTION TO ADDRESS PROCEDURAL ISSUES

Applicant Navigator Heartland Greenway LLC moves that the Commission enter an order addressing the following procedural issues at the evidentiary hearing set to begin on July 25, 2023:

- 1. If a party is represented by counsel, only counsel should be permitted to conduct cross-examination.
- 2. Cross-examination should be limited to the scope of direct examination. This is standard judicial practice because it not only saves time, but also preserves the fairness of the proceedings.
- 3. Cross-examination and re-direct examination should be limited to one round.

 This is necessary to prevent duplicative and redundant testimony and to allow the hearing to be completed in the number of days provided for the hearing.
- 4. The hearing must be completed by August 5. This is necessary so that the Commission may decide Navigator's permit application within the one-year deadline provided by SDCL § 49-41B-24.

5. If necessary to ensure timely completion of the hearing, the Commission should limit the time allowed for any party to cross-examine a witness. Navigator has identified 13 witnesses for hearing, including rebuttal witnesses. The unions that intervened have identified three witnesses. Staff has identified nine witnesses for hearing. The landowner Intervenors represented by Brian Jorde have filed 48 pieces of testimony for hearing. Navigator has filed a separate motion addressing duplicative and redundant testimony, but even if that motion is granted, it will not be possible to complete the hearing within the time allowed if counsel do not reasonably limit cross-examination.

Limits on cross-examination, including reasonable time limits, are consistent with due process and are within the scope of the Commission's ability to regulate the hearing process. In general, a court "should exercise reasonable control over the mode and order of examining witnesses and presenting evidence so as to (1) make those procedures effective for determining the truth; (2) avoid wasting time; and (3) protect witnesses from harassment or undue embarrassment." SDCL § 19-19-611. The South Dakota Supreme Court has held many times that reasonable limits on cross-examination are within a court's discretion and do not amount to a denial of due process. See, e.g., Matter of Guardianship of I.L.J.E., 2018 S.D. 81, ¶ 24, 921 N.W.2d 463, 471 ("In civil cases, while the suppression of all cross-examination may amount to a denial of due process, restriction of cross-examination will rarely rise to constitutional dimensions, although it might amount to an abuse of discretion where the probative value of the excluded evidence is sufficiently high."); City of Sioux Falls v. Johnson, 1999 S.D. 16, ¶ 18, 588 N.W.2d 904, 909 ("The trial court retains broad discretion concerning the limitation of crossexamination and it will be reversed only when there is a clear abuse of discretion and showing of prejudice."); State v. Kryger, 2018 S.D. 13, ¶ 16, 907 N.W.2d 800, 808 ("An individual is only

guaranteed an opportunity for effective cross-examination, not cross-examination that is

effective in whatever way, and to whatever extent, the defense might wish" (emphasis added).)

Navigator understands that some witnesses will require more time than others and so has

not proposed a set limit for all witnesses. Nevertheless, this motion is appropriate to raise the

issue before the hearing as a help to completing the hearing on time and as a reminder that limits

on cross-examination are common and consistent with due process. Navigator requests that the

Commission act on this motion by advising the parties that they should be attentive to time when

examining witnesses because if they are not, an order precluding further testimony of a witness

may be necessary.

Conclusion

Navigator respectfully requests that this motion be granted.
