


Intervening Landowners by and through their counsel of record, Brian Jorde, Domina Law Group, pc llo, and Ryan Cwach, Birmingham & Cwach Law Offices, PLLC, respectfully again move the Commission to deny the SCS Carbon Transport, LLC (hereinafter "Summit") application for the reasons discussed previously and those that will be further argued at hearing on April 22, 2025, and object to and resist Summit's Motion to Reconsider Applicant's Motion to Extend Deadline.



The yellow highlighted portion is the main trunkline of the originally proposed route and the currently proposed route in Summit's application.



Map 2 below was also taken from Summit's website as of April 22, 2025, Project Footprint - Project Footprint - Summit Carbon Solutions, by clicking on "South Dakota" and is the South Dakota specific proposed route overview as found in Summit's current application. The yellow highlighted portion shows the portion of the main transmission line from Iowa and to North Dakota of the currently proposed route in Summit's application.




Map 4 below is also a map showing McPherson County depicting the same as Map 3 but in a different presentation showing relevant Landowner/Declarants' names.
