- 1 Q. Please state your name and business address for the record.
- 2 A. My name is Janice "Jan" Patterson.
- 3 Q. What is your occupation?
- 4 A. I am a Spink County landowner grew up on family farm and now own farmland in
- 5 Spink County that is leased to our nephew.
- 6 Q. Please briefly describe your operation.
- 7 A. Our operation includes farm ground. We lease our land to our nephew who grows corn
- 8 and beans on the land. My sister and I are both retired nurses, and my husband is a psychologist.
- 9 Though we have not lived on the farm for many years, we have always been very supportive of
- 10 farming.
- 11 Q. Please describe your affiliation with Summit and Glacial Lakes Energy?
- 12 A. My son-in-law works for Glacial Lakes, and we have always been supportive of the
- ethanol industry. I believe the ethanol plants have been very good for farmers and surrounding
- 14 communities. My nephew (who leases our land) sells corn.
- 15 Q. What is the basis for your testimony?
- 16 A. I seek to see agriculture, Summit, and ethanol succeed and to testify that the Summit
- 17 project is good for farmers, ethanol plants, and South Dakota in general.
- 18 Q. Why is the Summit project necessary for you/your neighbors/South
- 19 Dakota/Ethanol?
- 20 A. I believe this project will increase corn prices for farmers, thereby enhancing the
- 21 economy of South Dakota.
- 22 Q. What does Summit mean to you in terms of opportunities to grow your operation?

- 1 A. If corn prices increase, land values will continue to grow. As a landowner, this is a big
- 2 plus. We signed easements with Summit early on in the process.
- 3 Q. What context is missing from the concerns stated by others?
- 4 A. Ethanol buys and uses a tremendous amount of corn and is looking to the future to sell
- 5 low-carbon gasoline to the airlines. This will certainly increase the need for corn and increase
- 6 the price for corn.
- 7 Q. What fears do you have if the project is not completed?
- 8 A. The price of corn has not risen (except for a couple of years 2021-2023) over the past
- 9 10 plus years. If the project is not completed, I believe that corn prices will remain low, and
- 10 South Dakota will not reap the benefits economically from increased revenue for corn growers
- and owners as well as taxes for South Dakota.
- 12 Q. Has your county acted against the project?
- 13 A. Several landowners in Spink County and Brown County, where I live, have acted against
- the easements.
- 15 Q. How do you feel about that? How do you feel about other counties which have tried
- 16 to stop the project?
- 17 A. I am empathetic to the concerns of easements for farmers. However, I am also an
- advocate for improving the economy for all in South Dakota. The land needed for the easement
- will still be tillable, and Summit has addressed any potential loss in productivity of the land for
- 20 the first three years. I also know that some landowners are concerned about the safety of the
- 21 project. Most projects have some type of safety concerns. However, as I read over the
- 22 information regarding past safety incidents, there appears to be only one large incident that has
- 23 occurred, and that was several years ago. No one was killed. Summit has implemented new

- 1 safety steps to hopefully prevent a future occurrence. Compared to gas and oil pipelines, the
- 2 hazard potential is <u>much less</u>.
- 3 Q. Do you have safety concerns about the Summit project?
- 4 A. As I stated above, I empathize, but Summit has addressed the safety issues and is being
- 5 proactive in this project.
- 6 Q. Is your ground part of the Summit project?
- 7 A. Yes, it is.
- 8 Q. How was your easement experience? Were you fairly treated and compensated?
- 9 A. We signed easements with Summit in order to protect, evolve, and maintain our way of
- 10 life. Our interactions with Summit were positive, and we were treated with respect. Individuals
- that we visited with were kind and helpful in answering any questions and making requested
- 12 changes as it concerned the depth of the pipe and the path of the pipe. They have always
- 13 contacted us regarding their need to enter the fields.
- 14 Q. Does your ground currently have other easements?
- 15 A. Not that I am aware.
- 16 Q. What has been your overall experience with easements, both Summit and others?
- 17 A. My experience with Summit has been positive. My husband's family had experience
- with the Keystone pipeline several years ago. I do not believe there were any difficulties with
- 19 this. However, I do not believe that, at that time, landowners questioned the process. As we all
- 20 know the safety issues with gas and oil pipelines can be far more hazardous environmentally and
- 21 more deadly.
- 22 Q. Does this conclude your testimony?
- 23 A. Yes.
